2007 ASSEMBLY BILL 442

Under current law, the Department of Transportation (DOT) issues special distinguishing registration plates for certain vehicles to members of certain “authorized special groups.” Assembly Bill 442 creates a new authorized special group license plate for people interested in supporting the efforts of Donate Life Wisconsin (DLW) and the promotion of organ and tissue donation. Special group members are required to pay an additional \$15 fee for issuance or reissuance of the special plates and an additional \$25 annual fee. The bill requires the DOT to distribute funds in excess of the first \$27,600, the initial costs of production of the special plate, to DLW.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 to 2007 Assembly Bill 442 directs the DOT to forward all extra funds that are in excess of the initial costs of production of the authorized special group plate to the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS) for distribution to DLW. The amendment also increases the initial costs of production of the special plate from \$27,600 to \$43,200.

Legislative History

The Assembly Committee on Transportation recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 0, and passage of Assembly Bill 442, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 0.
