Intent: Provide DATCP with a general obligation bonding authority increase of \$10,000,000 for the Soil and Water Resource Management Program.

Proposal

Provide the department \$10.0 million in bond revenue authority for landowner cost-share grants to ensure that the state makes reasonable progress in achieving statewide conservation priorities.

Background

With steady growth in conservation needs, cost-sharing for bondable practices such as manure storage and grassed waterways has not kept pace with demand. Counties have a core need for funds to implement their state-mandated land and water resource management plans including cost-sharing to meet agricultural performance standards.

While this need remains unmet, counties are also facing new demands for cost-share dollars to address high profile issues of state significance such as manure runoff events and nutrient management.

With the addition of \$12.0 million in the last biennium for cost-sharing nutrient management plans, we have created additional need for cost-sharing to install manure storage and other hard practices necessary to support nutrient management.

As the demand for funds has grown, DATCP has been using all of the funds authorized for cost-sharing. By the end of the biennium, DATCP will have expended or committed all bond revenue funds authorized through FY09 (\$33,075,000).

Suggested Statutory Language

20.866(2) (we) *Agriculture, soil and water*. From the capital improvement fund, a sum sufficient for the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection to provide for soil and water resource management under s. 92.14. The state may contract public debt in an amount not to exceed ~~\$33,075,000~~ \$43,075,000 for this purpose.

AGRICULTURE

Under current law, DATCP administers the Soil and Water Resource Management Program. The program provides grants for land and water resource management projects and for the construction of animal waste management systems. This bill increases the general obligation bonding authority for the Soil and Water Resource Management Program by \$10,000,000.
