Hi Jenna --

I notice this draft is "IN", but, unfortunately, I am sort of at a standstill. In an effort to move forward, here is what I proposed to do with this draft, followed by some specific questions:

- ✓ 1. Mostly duplicate but modify with "innovation fund" language where necessary the language in the following sections of the Wisconsin Development Fund:

560.602
 560.605 (1) (a) through (o), (2m), and (7)
 560.607

 560.68

- ✓ Okay? Good idea. That should work well.

- ✓ 2. Does Commerce want me to create any definitions other than "eligible activities"? To duplicate any of the definitions under s. 560.60? I'll ask Commerce, but it makes sense to me to duplicate the definitions under 560.60, but replace the board with a new economic policy board (members are TBD) and replace the eligible activities with the list of purposes we are expecting from Commerce.

- ✓ 3. When I create a definition "eligible activities," should it be the same as the 7 purposes listed in the initial request? It should be the purposes that we are expecting from Commerce. Hopefully the edited 7 purposes will contain less jargon and be more direct like the WDF eligible activities.

- ✓ 4. Does Commerce want me to create a Board to advise the department on expenditures from the fund like the development finance board, created under s. 15.155 (1), advises the department on the WI Development Fund?


→ Yes. Please create an Economic Development Policy Board. I'm checking with Commerce on the desired membership. For now, it makes sense to use the development finance board as a placeholder.

Hi Jenna -

Here are a couple of follow-up questions and an attempt -- by me -- to clarify points raised in our telephone conversation on Friday mid-day (before my email to you that same day; those questions still stand):

1. Under this request, Commerce seeks to consolidate the money available under three separate programs (the Community Based Economic Development Program under s. 560.14, the Rural Economic Development Program under s. 560.17, and the Minority Business Grants and Loans program under subch. VII of ch. 560) into one large program (the Forward Innovation Fund). The pooling of money would allow Commerce more flexibility in the making of (grants or loans), but the money would only be available for one of the seven goals identified in the drafting request. Is that correct?

The money would be available to any business or organization in Wisconsin, just like the Development Fund. The 7 purposes (Commerce is sending me an updated, more helpful list of purposes) will be included in statute, but Commerce will be allowed to promulgate rules to clarify.

(1) what definitions?
 (2) want to create a Bd to guide?

2. You indicated that you thought we should keep the definitions under the separate programs, but otherwise the existing programs would be subsumed by the new program. After we discussed the implications of this approach, we decided it would be good for you to communicate with Commerce to find out whether any other provisions of the three existing programs *other than the definitions* (such as identities and eligibility requirements of applicants) will be retained.

It seems after speaking with Commerce that the identities and eligibility requirements will not be retained. The eligibility will be blown open and replaced by the 7 purposes.

Here are some questions that could be addressed by the answer to that question or that may need to be addressed in addition to that question:

- a. Who will be eligible to apply for or receive a (grant or loan) under the new program (only those entities defined under the three current programs)? Any WI business or organization
- b. Will there be any limits on the amount of money any person, business, non profit organization, etc. can receive under the program (will any of the limits under current law apply or will this be left entirely to the discretion of Commerce)? Left to the discretion of Commerce
- c. Will there be any limit on the *number* of (grants or loans) a person, business, nonprofit organization, etc. may receive (will any of the limits under current law apply or will this be left entirely to the discretion of Commerce)? Left to the discretion of Commerce
- d. Will Commerce be required to consider any particular goals or objectives in making a determination about which of

multiple applicants should receive the (grant or loan) under the program (see, for example, the considerations under s. 560.14 (3) (c), 560.17 (4), and 560.84). This will be the 7 purposes and whatever administrative rules Commerce develops as additional guidance

3. If Commerce indicates that no other provisions of the three separate programs should be retained, I wonder whether we need the definitions at all... We shouldn't need the definitions unless they are referenced by the revised 7 purposes expected from Commerce

4. Commerce is currently required to coordinate the making of some grants and loans under the Rural Economic Development Program with DATCP. Will this partnership remain for any of the new goals? This partnership should remain in place. I assume a revised version of # 3 in the 7 purposes will be more specific about rural assistance.

I don't think I can make any headway on this draft until I have a bit more clarity on what Commerce hopes to accomplish with this request. I look forward to hearing from you.

Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) may award grants under the Community-Based Economic Development Program to community-based organizations and political subdivisions. Recipients of a grant under this program must undertake certain eligible activities, which include providing assistance to businesses and entrepreneurs that will, in turn, provide jobs in the community.

Under current law, at the request of the Rural Economic Development Board in Commerce, Commerce may award grants or loans under the Rural Economic Development Program to a business located in a rural municipality if the business is starting or expanding its operations and agrees to use the grant or loan to undertake certain eligible activities.

Under current law, the Minority Business Development Board in Commerce may award a grant or loan under the Minority Business Grant and Loan Program to a minority group member, a minority business, certain nonprofit organizations, or private financial institutions. The recipient of a grant or loan under the Minority Business Grant and Loan Program must agree to undertake certain eligible activities, which including education and training projects or the start-up, expansion, or acquisition of a business.

Under current law, the Development Finance Board in Commerce awards grants under the Wisconsin Development Fund program.

This bill eliminates the ~~the~~ Community-Based Economic Development Program, the Rural Economic Development Program and Rural Economic Development Board, the Minority Business Grant and Loan Program and Minority Business Development Board, and the Development Finance Board. The bill creates the Economic Policy Board ~~in Commerce~~. The responsibilities of the Development Finance Board will be assumed by the Economic Policy Board (board), which will have the following members:

1. The secretary of Commerce or ^{his or her} ~~the secretary's~~ designee. DWD
2. The secretary of ~~The Department of Workforce Development~~ or ~~the~~ ^{his or her} ~~secretary's~~ designee.
3. The director of the Technical College System Board or ~~the director's~~ ^{his or her} designee.
4. Six other members nominated by the governor, and with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed ^(S) ^(S) for 2-year terms. These members shall represent the scientific, technical, labor, small business, minority business, rural, and financial communities of this state.
5. One member appointed by the speaker of the Assembly.
6. One member appointed by the senate majority leader.

The bill also creates the ~~Forward Innovation Fund~~ (FIF). Under the FIF, Commerce may, in consultation with the board, award grants or ~~loans~~ to the following eligible recipients to undertake certain eligible activities:

1. Businesses.
2. Municipalities.
3. Community-based organizations.
4. Cooperatives ~~associations~~ ^{incorporated} under Chapter 185 or ~~organized~~ ^{under Chapter 193}.
5. Local development corporations.
6. Nonprofit organizations working on economic or community development.

- Eligible activities under the FIF include:
1. The start-up, expansion, or retention of minority businesses.
 2. The start-up, expansion, or retention of businesses in economically distressed areas.
 3. Innovative proposals to strengthen inner cities.
 4. Innovative proposals to strengthen rural communities.
 5. Innovative programs to strengthen clusters.
 6. Innovative proposals to strengthen entrepreneurship.

Recipients of a grant or loan ~~under the Forward Innovation Fund program~~ ^{from the FIF} must provide a 25% match. Commerce ~~is required to~~ ^{must} promulgate rules to implement and administer the ~~new program~~.

Under current law, Commerce may ~~award~~ ^{make} grants to the Wisconsin Business Initiative Corporation (WBIC) from the Community-Based Economic Development appropriation. This bill creates ~~a new~~ ^{an} appropriation for grants to the WBIC.
