



## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

**2009 Senate Bill 47**

**2009 Senate Bill 47** prohibits, with exceptions, a business entity from placing, or causing to be placed, within a highway right-of-way any sign that advertises or promotes: (1) a business identified on the sign; or (2) a business *whose telephone number appears* on the sign. If a sign has been placed in violation of this prohibition and the business identified on the sign or *whose telephone number appears* on the sign **had the sign made**, there is a rebuttable presumption that this business caused the sign to be placed in violation of this prohibition.

**Senate Amendment 1 to the bill** adds “*or Internet web site*” to what may not appear on a sign prohibited under the bill. Thus, the bill, as amended, would prohibit, with exceptions, a business entity from placing, or causing to be placed, within a highway right-of-way any sign that advertises or promotes: (1) a business identified on the sign; or (2) a business whose telephone number *or Internet web site appears* on the sign. In addition, if a sign has been placed in violation of this prohibition and the business identified on the sign or whose telephone number *or Internet web site appears* on the sign **had the sign made**, there is a rebuttable presumption that this business caused the sign to be placed in violation of this prohibition.

### **Legislative History**

At an executive session on February 11, 2010, the Senate Committee on Transportation, Tourism, Forestry and Natural Resources voted to adopt Senate Amendment 1 to the bill on a vote of Ayes, 7; Noes, 0. The committee then voted to recommend passage of the bill as amended on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 2.
