

Representative Knilans,

Thank you for your call today to our office. The only reason we do not sell in WI (which is the only state we do not sell in) is because of the plumbing code referenced in the attached PDF letter mailed to us in 2005.

WI must approve every plumbing product and they include water treatment products with the plumbing products. If a water treatment product has approval from a large testing agency like NSF, WI will recognize that and typically approve the product. For our type of newer technology, NSF and others do not have any standard testing protocols. Therefore, we would need to work with the state of WI, agree on a testing protocol, pay to have the testing done, etc. We are unwilling to do that, especially for several products when the plumbing code just needs to be changed. MA had a similar law until 2009 which is why I attached the other document.

Thank you for your interest in this problem. It has been a frustration to us, many other water treatment companies and countless (we get calls every week) WI homeowners for many years.

If there is any way we can help in the process or you need more info from me, below is my direct line.

Just for the record, several other representative's offices have called over the past several years, but it seemed that it was just to give an answer to the complaining residents and not really to change the plumbing code and fix the problem.

**RE: Unapproved Residential Water Treatment Devices being sold and Offered for Sale
in Wisconsin**

Dear Mr. Freije:

Chapter Comm 84, of the Wisconsin Administrative Code (Wis. Adm. Code), requires that all residential water treatment devices be approved by this department prior to being sold for use in a residential plumbing system, offered for sale in a residential plumbing system or installed in a residential plumbing system. Presently, we do not regulate commercial/industrial water treatment devices. We have been notified that Mr. Joseph Wojnarowski, a FREIJE distributor/dealer active in and around Milwaukee Wisconsin, continues to sell and offer for sale various unapproved residential water treatment devices despite our letter sent directly to him on December 3, 2003.

Sale or installation of unapproved residential water devices is a violation of Section 145.132 of Wisconsin State Statute, in addition to being a code violation. Violations of Section 145.132, Wisconsin State Statute, may be subject to fines of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$1,000.00 for each violation. Each violation constitutes a separate offense, and each day of continued violation is a separate offense. Installations of unapproved residential water treatment devices may be ordered removed.

Enclosed is the third Plumbing Product Review Application and list of "Required Information for the Review of Water Treatment Devices" in case the first two sets of documents we've provided to FREIJE were misplaced.

This is the final effort on behalf of this department to rectify this ongoing situation outside the scope of enforcement. Further violations of State Statute 145.132 and/or ch. Comm 84 of the Wis. Adm. Code by FREIJE will be promptly referred directly to our departmental council, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, and the Wisconsin Department of Justice, along with all the supporting documentation we've amassed over the last two years, without further notice to FREIJE. Understand that our departmental philosophy is education first, enforcement secondly. Enforcement is a last resort that we would prefer not to use, however, to date; the actions of FREIJE in Wisconsin limit our future options.

Water Filtration Systems

The Board of State Examiners of Plumbers and Gas Fitters on September 30, 2009, at a regularly scheduled meeting voted to no longer require approval for the following products:

- in-line refrigerator water filters
 - reverse osmosis systems
 - water softeners
- faucets mounted water filter
- point of entry water filters
- household filtration units

and similar products as listed above.

The Board only has jurisdiction over the inlet and outlet connections and all associated piping from the source and to the fixture/equipment must be installed by the licensed Massachusetts Plumber.

The board asks that all manufacturers of the products listed above, send in a list of all models that would fall into these categories. That will assist the Board in eliminating only these types of product from their accepted list.

In my opinion, the description of the water treatment equipment for what you are drafting should be "all water treatment devices, both Point-of-Entry (POE) and Point-of-Use (POU)". This will include everything. It's like saying all people, both men and woman.

As you can see in the NSF link below under "Styles of Water Treatment Devices", there are many types of water treatment devices, but they all fall into 2 categories, POE and POU. You either treat water when it first enters a home or building in which case you are treating all of it, or you treat somewhere in the building, where some portion of the water is being used (like at your sink or refrigerator etc).

Under current law, the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) regulates the construction, installation, and maintenance of plumbing.
