7 (b) Subsection (1) does not apply to a contract between a research company and
8 the University of Wisconsin–Madison for purchase of goods or services, including
9 research, if all of the following apply:

10 1. The contract is approved by a University of Wisconsin–Madison employee
11 or officer responsible for evaluating and managing potential conflicts of interest.

12 2. Either of the following apply:

13 a. The contract together with all other contracts between the same parties
14 require less than \$250,000 in payments over a 24-month period.

15 b. The University of Wisconsin–Madison submits the contract to the Board of
16 Trustees of the University of Wisconsin–Madison and, within 45 days, the Board of
17 Trustees determines that the contract benefits the state and any conflicts of interest
18 are appropriately managed by the University of Wisconsin–Madison.

21 **SECTION 9152. Nonstatutory provisions; University of Wisconsin**
22 **System.**

23 (1) TRANSFER OF UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN–MADISON.

24 (a) *Definitions.* In this subsection:

1 1. "Authority" means the University of Wisconsin-Madison authority, as
2 created by this act.

3 2. "Board of Trustees" means the Board of Trustees of the authority.

4 3. "Board of Regents" means the Board of Regents of the system.

5 4. "Secretary" means the secretary of administration.

6 5. "System" means the University of Wisconsin System.

7 (b) *Assets and liabilities.* On the effective date of this paragraph, the assets and
8 liabilities of the system, including real property and moneys in the university trust
9 funds, that relate to the operation of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, as
10 determined by the secretary, shall become the assets and liabilities of the authority.

11 (c) *Tangible personal property; records.* On the effective date of this paragraph,
12 all tangible personal property, including records, of the system that relates to the
13 operation of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, as determined by the secretary,
14 is transferred to the authority.

15 (d) *Employees.* All incumbent employees holding positions in the system and
16 assigned to the University of Wisconsin-Madison are transferred on the effective
17 date of this paragraph to the authority. Until July 1, 2012, the authority shall adhere
18 to the terms of any collective bargaining agreement covering the employees that is
19 in force on the effective date of this paragraph, including terms relating to employer
20 payment of any employee required contributions under the Wisconsin Retirement
21 System and employer payment of any health insurance premiums on behalf of
22 employees. Beginning July 1, 2012, the authority shall establish the compensation
23 and benefits of the employees under the terms of the personnel system established
24 by the board of trustees under section 37.11 (1g) of the statutes, as created by this
25 act.

1 (e) *Contracts and agreements.* 1. All contracts entered into by the Board of
2 Regents in effect on the effective date of this paragraph that are primarily related
3 to the operation of the University of Wisconsin–Madison, as determined by the
4 secretary, remain in effect and are transferred to the Board of Trustees.

5 2. All agreements entered into between the Board of Regents and the Board of
6 Directors of the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority under
7 section 233.04 (7) and (7m) of the statutes in effect on the effective date of this
8 paragraph remain in effect and are transferred to the Board of Trustees.

9 3. The Board of Trustees shall carry out any obligations under such contracts
10 and agreements until the contract or agreement is modified or rescinded by the
11 Board of Trustees to the extent allowed under the contract or agreement.

12 (em) *Cooperative agreements.* Notwithstanding paragraph (e), any academic,
13 research, or outreach program or activity that was being conducted by the University
14 of Wisconsin–Madison by means of a cooperative agreement or memorandum of
15 understanding with an institution within the system, the University of
16 Wisconsin–Extension, or the University of Wisconsin Colleges immediately before
17 the effective date of this paragraph continues regardless of any changes in the
18 structure or mechanism of funding the program or activity until the Board of
19 Trustees and the other institution mutually agree to modify the agreement or
20 memorandum of understanding or funds are no longer appropriated for the program
21 or activity.

22 (f) *Rules.* The Board of Trustees shall enforce the rules promulgated by the
23 Board of Regents under section 36.11 (1) (a), (c), and (cm) of the statutes, as affected
24 by this act, that are in effect on the effective date of this paragraph on university
25 property as if the Board of Trustees had promulgated them. The rules shall continue

1 to apply until the Board of Trustees promulgates rules under section 37.11 (1m) (a),
2 (c), and (cm) of the statutes, as affected by this act.

3 (g) *Policies and procedures.* All policies and procedures of the system that are
4 in effect on the effective date of this paragraph, and that relate to the operation of
5 the University of Wisconsin–Madison, and all policies and procedures of the
6 University of Wisconsin–Madison that are in effect on the effective date of this
7 paragraph, become policies and procedures of the authority and remain in effect
8 until their specified expiration date or until modified or rescinded by the Board of
9 Trustees.

10 (h) *Pending matters.* Any matter pending with the Board of Regents on the
11 effective date of this paragraph that is primarily related to the operation of the
12 University of Wisconsin–Madison, as determined by the secretary, is transferred to
13 the Board of Trustees and all materials submitted to or actions taken by the Board
14 of Regents with respect to the pending matters are considered as having been
15 submitted to or taken by the Board of Trustees.

16 (i) *Board of Regents duties.* Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) to (h), until the
17 Board of Trustees notifies the Board of Regents that the transfers under this
18 subsection have been completed, the Board of Regents shall provide the authority
19 with the usual and customary services that the Board of Regents provided to the
20 University of Wisconsin–Madison prior to the effective date of this paragraph and
21 with any other services or resources necessary to complete the transfers under this
22 subsection.

23 **SECTION 9155. Nonstatutory provisions; Other.**

24 (1) UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN–MADISON EMPLOYEES. Notwithstanding section
25 230.03 (3) of the statutes, the University of Wisconsin–Madison authority shall be

1 considered an agency, as defined in section 230.03 of the statutes, until July 1, 2012,
2 for all purposes under chapter 230 of the statutes and all employees of the University
3 of Wisconsin-Madison authority who were in the classified service of the state civil
4 service and who were transferred to the authority under SECTION 9152 (1) (d) shall
5 have all the rights and privileges offered classified employees until July 1, 2012. The
6 department of employee trust funds shall continue to administer the program
7 defined in section 230.12 (9) of the statutes on behalf of the employees of the
8 University of Wisconsin-Madison under sections 37.13, 37.15, and 37.17 of the
9 statutes, as created by this act, until June 30, 2012.

10 (2) UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MADISON BOARD OF TRUSTEES; INITIAL
11 APPOINTMENTS. Notwithstanding the lengths of the terms specified in section 37.02
12 (1) (a) of the statutes, as created by this act, the initial members of the Board of
13 Trustees of the University of Wisconsin-Madison shall be initially appointed for the
14 following terms:

15 (a) The member appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 1. a. of the statutes, as
16 created by this act, the member appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 1. b. of the
17 statutes, as created by this act, 2 members appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 1.
18 c. of the statutes, as created by this act, a member appointed under section 37.02 (1)
19 (a) 2. a. of the statutes, as created by this act, the member appointed under section
20 37.02 (1) (a) 2. b. of the statutes, as created by this act, and 2 members appointed
21 under section 37.02 (1) (a) 2. c. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms
22 expiring on May 1, 2014.

23 (b) Four members appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 1. c. of the statutes, as
24 created by this act, 2 members appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 2. d. of the

1 statutes, as created by this act, and the member appointed under section 37.02 (1)
2 (a) 3. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms expiring on May 1, 2013.

3 (c) Three members appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 1. c. of the statutes,
4 as created by this act, a member appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a) 2. a. of the
5 statutes, as created by this act, and 2 members appointed under section 37.02 (1) (a)
6 2. e. of the statutes, as created by this act, for terms expiring on May 1, 2012.

7 **SECTION 9455. Effective dates; Other.**

8 (1) DUAL EMPLOYMENT. The repeal and recreation of section 16.417 (1) (a) of the
9 statutes takes effect on January 1, 2012.

10 (2) UNIVERSITY TRUST FUNDS. The repeal of section 20.280 (1) (zz) of the statutes
11 takes effect on July 1, 2013.
