RE: Eliminating Department of Commerce, Commerce employees, and Commerce appropriations and programs; moving specific programs from Commerce to Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, Department of Administration, WHEDA, and/or Department of Regulation and Licensing

The Department of Commerce will be eliminated at the end of FY2011. Therefore, please create a draft that has the following elements:

- Eliminates all positions, appropriations and funding at Commerce effective July 1, 2011 or passage of biennial budget
- Eliminates all programs administered by Commerce, except the following programs, to be moved to specific agencies:

Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (Chapter 238)

- 1) 560.32 – Allocation of volume cap on tax-exempt bonds
- 2) 560.034 – Employment impact estimates – *but del. 560.033?*
- 3) 560.075 – Repayment of grants, loans, and tax benefits

I think the following should also be included in the COM/WEDC draft (BB0227).

All of the appropriations related to tribal gaming are moving from Commerce to either DOA or Tourism. Namely:

- 20.143(1)(kf) - Technical assistance
 - This is transferred from 20.505(8)(hm)6f à delete this provision and create a new provision transferring funding to DOA Intergovernmental Relations
- 20.143(1)(kg) – American Indian economic development specialist
 - This is transferred from 20.505(8)(hm)6g à delete this provision and create a new provision transferring funding to Tourism
- 20.143(1)(kj) – Gaming economic development
 - This is transferred from 20.505(8)(hm)6j à delete this provision and create a new provision transferring funding to Tourism
- Increase the transfer under 20.505(8)(hm) by \$1,183,600.

Chris,

Here are the changes to both the COM Prog 2/WHEDA draft (BB0169) and the COM to WEDC budget draft (BB0227).

- ✓1. Draft BB0169 can be deleted. Housing is no longer going to WHEDA. It is now moving to the WEDC along with the other programs listed in the memo for BB0227. Eliminate the housing assistance stuff the same way economic/community development programs are being eliminated.
- ✓2. Don't include anything referencing WTC. The goal of eliminating the programs at COM is to allow the maximum amount of flexibility for the new corporation. The WEDC will be able to decide where to allocate its annual funding. As long as the draft doesn't specifically exclude providing funds to WTC (or any other entity), we do not need to include it, correct?
- ✓3. 560.03 (23): Delete the requirement.
- ~~X~~4. WI Act 125: make online reporting a requirement for WEDC as well. ✓
- ~~X~~5. Jobs Tax Credit change: under current law, the jobs tax credit has an upper limit of \$100,000. The Governor would like to eliminate the upper limit. Currently, new jobs created in tier I counties/munis receive credit of 10% for jobs earning between \$20,000 and \$100,000, while tier II counties/munis receive 10% for jobs earning between \$30,000 and \$100,000. The Governor would like new jobs to earn credits of 10% of wages, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per job created (regardless of whether the job pays over \$100,000). ✓
- ✓6. The LAB statutes specifically mention two COM programs that need to be audited with specific dates. Please change the language to reflect the audits will now include WEDC economic development programs (mm) and economic development tax credits (ms).
 - 1. 13.94(1)(mm): statewide economic development programs by July 1, 2012.
 - 2. 13.94(1)(ms): economic development tax credits (currently at COM; being moved to WEDC) by July 1, 2014.

Call/email with any questions about the above. Some of these things many make more sense verbally. I will look into the COM/WHEDA relationship in terms of WEDC and get back to you.

A few questions:

- 1. From the instructions I received yesterday, it looks like the intent is to eliminate current Commerce housing assistance stuff, rather than transfer it. Is that correct?

2. Current s. 560.27 directs Commerce a high-technology business development corporation, which is the WI Technology Council. Should the draft specify what is to happen to the council? I don't think the repeal of s. 560.27 necessarily makes the nonstock nonprofit corporation disappear.

3. Under s 560.03 (23), the secretary of commerce must review the business plans of certain persons who intend to apply for a permit under s. 170.12 to raise sunken timber. Should that duty be transferred elsewhere or should that review requirement be deleted?

4. 2007 Act 125 required Commerce, and several other agencies, to submit reports on economic development assistance and to make that information available on the web. If Commerce's report is no longer required, should the requirement for other agencies to make identical reports remain?

Chris,

Can you clarify #1? Do you mean that WEDC will have some role in housing, but not in the form of specified programs, such that subch. X of ch. 560 and related approps need not be transferred? All of the funding that currently goes to housing (program 2) will be given to WEDC as part of the block grant in the budget. However, none of the specific housing programs defined in subch X of 560 should transfer to the WEDC. This should allow the WEDC to determine whether it wants to continue all, some, or none of the housing programs currently at COM. If so, should housing be incorporated into WEDC's duties under LRB-0928 (SB 6)?

As to WTC, as long as it's consistent with WEDC's duties, WEDC can provide whatever funding it chooses to.

Act 125 reporting: should the current requirement under 560.01 (2) (am) be transferred to WEDC in its entirety? No. In LRB-0928 (SB6) a requirement already exists that the WEDC submit an annual report of its activities to the legislature. Can we change the language in 560.01(2)(am) when moving it to WEDC to refer to this report, ie somehow reference 238.07 as the report in the current language? Online reporting should stay to adhere to Act 125. The remaining subsections of 560.01(2)(am) can be deleted (1-9).

What about coordination with state agencies that also have some role in economic development, per 560.01 (2) (as)? Yes; move 560.01(2)(as), 560.01(2)(as)(2) and 560.01(3) to WEDC. Delete 560.01(2)(as)(2)(b).

I will get you the WHEDA ch 234 directions shortly.

It seems unlikely, given that under s. 66.1104 (2) (e), some of the waivers had until 12/31/10 to be completed. Also, is Commerce's work under this section done once the reallocations are complete, or is there bond monitoring even after reallocation? If the answer to either of these questions is no, this section may need to be transferred, not just repealed.

If you like, I could try to get ahold of someone at Commerce who could answer that question.

I don't quite understand--if the feds require a SHP, I'm not sure why it makes sense to repeal the statute that says who must prepare one, and when, and how. In addition, 560.9802, which directs Commerce to prepare the SHP, is currently cross-referenced in ss. 13.099 (1) (b) (review of legislation affecting housing) and 227.115 (1) (b) (review of administrative rules affecting housing), and in ss. 234.034, 234.06 (1), (3), 234.165 (2) (b) 2., and 234.25 (1) (e) (all WHEDA provisions that basically say that WHEDA's housing-related activities have to be consistent with the statewide housing plan). So it does serve other functions under state law, besides just informing the review of legislation.

I can prepare a simple amendment adding housing to WEDC's duties, just as I can prepare a simple amendment that changes WEDC's reporting requirements, or whatever you want to add or delete from SS AB 6, or I can prepare a substitute amendment that does one or more of those things. It's totally up to you. In terms of housekeeping, putting a substitute amendment together sometimes keeps things tidier and easier to keep track of.

Chris,

I spoke with Commerce's budget director and the statewide housing plan is something that is required federally. Therefore, I don't think we need to specifically mention it in the statutes. Let's repeal 13.099 and 560.9802.

Currently there is no mention of housing functions or responsibilities at WEDC in SB6 (Housing was only added to WEDC very recently). Can you amend the language in SB6 to add language speaking to WEDC's housing and community development functions in the duties of the board (238.03) portion of the statutes? Something similar to 560.9803(1)(a) would suffice: "the corporation may do all of the following: make grants or loans to persons or families of low or moderate income to defray housing costs of the person or family."

Also, please add the following statutes for the WEDC budget bill draft:

- 15.137(2)(a)(3m)
- 85.095(2)(b)
- 93.33(5)

You may have already thought about this one in getting AB 6 drafted, so I apologize if that's the case. The instructions for BB0227 call for the repeal of 560.097, which requires Commerce to monitor compliance with 106.16 (3). Under 106.16, a business that receive an economic development grant or loan from Commerce, WHEDA, or WHEFA must give notice of any job openings related to the project for which the business got the grant or loan. Also, WHEDA and WHEFA must give notice to Commerce when they award a grant or loan. I don't know much about 106.16--it's not my drafting area.

Questions: do you want to repeal 116.16? If not, who should perform Commerce's duties under 106.16? And should someone assume Commerce's duty to monitor compliance with 106.16?

Can you clarify #1? Do you mean that WEDC will have some role in housing, but not in the form of specified programs, such that subch. X of ch. 560 and related approps need not be transferred? All of the funding that currently goes to housing (program 2) will be given to WEDC as part of the block grant in the budget. However, none of the specific housing programs defined in subch X of 560 should transfer to the WEDC. This should allow the WEDC to determine whether it wants to continue all, some, or none of the housing programs currently at COM. If so, should housing be incorporated into WEDC's duties under LRB-0928 (SB 6)?

As to WTC, as long as it's consistent with WEDC's duties, WEDC can provide whatever funding it

The past two-years, Commerce has given grants to regional economic development organizations (such as the New North and Milwaukee M7) of \$100,000 for marketing purposes. The grants required dollar-for-dollar matches from the reg. ed orgs. This was not a statutory program; Commerce signed contracts with each grant recipient requiring matching funds. A representative of the orgs asked that the grants be made statutorily required. There are seven generally recognized regional ED orgs in Wisconsin. What is the easiest way to put this program into statute without getting into defining what regional economic development means? If we do need a definition, the easiest way to narrow down the eligible applicants would be to define regional ED org as an entity representing more than 2 counties.

I think including the UP TO \$100,000 is a good idea; can we include that the grant is for marketing without defining what marketing is? Let's also require the dollar-for-dollar match if possible.
