1 (a) *Definitions.* In this subsection:

2 1. "Authority" means the University of Wisconsin–Madison authority, as  
3 created by this act.

4 2. "Board of Trustees" means the Board of Trustees of the authority.

5 3. "Board of Regents" means the Board of Regents of the system.

6 4. "Secretary" means the secretary of administration.

7 5. "System" means the University of Wisconsin System.

8 (b) *Assets and liabilities.* On the effective date of this paragraph, the assets and  
9 liabilities of the system, including real property and moneys in the university trust  
10 funds, that relate to the operation of the University of Wisconsin–Madison, as  
11 determined by the secretary, shall become the assets and liabilities of the authority.

12 (c) *Tangible personal property; records.* On the effective date of this paragraph,  
13 all tangible personal property, including records, of the system that relates to the  
14 operation of the University of Wisconsin–Madison, as determined by the secretary,  
15 is transferred to the authority.

16 (d) *Employees.* All incumbent employees holding positions in the system and  
17 assigned to the University of Wisconsin–Madison are transferred on the effective  
18 date of this paragraph to the authority. Until July 1, 2012, the authority shall adhere  
19 to the terms of any collective bargaining agreement covering the employees that is  
20 in force on the effective date of this paragraph, including terms relating to employer  
21 payment of any employee required contributions under the Wisconsin Retirement  
22 System and employer payment of any health insurance premiums on behalf of  
23 employees. Beginning July 1, 2012, the authority shall establish the compensation  
24 and benefits of the employees under the terms of the personnel system established

1 by the board of trustees under section 37.11 (1g) of the statutes, as created by this

5 liabilities of the department of veterans affairs primarily related to functions as the  
6 state approval agency for the education of veterans and other eligible persons, as  
7 determined by the secretary of administration, shall become the assets and liabilities  
8 of the department of safety and professional services.

9           (b) *Employee transfers.* All positions, and the incumbent employees holding  
10 those positions, in the department of veterans affairs performing duties primarily  
11 related to functions as the state approval agency for the education of veterans and  
12 other eligible persons, as determined by the secretary of administration, are
