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

PUBLIC INSTRUCTION -- GENERAL SCHOOL AIDS AND REVENUE LIMITS

Modifications to K-12 School Finance System
[LFB Papers #525 and 526]

Motion:

Move to make the following modifications to the state's K-12 school finance system, beginning in 2012-13:

- ✓ *General School Aid Funding Increase.* Provide an additional \$332.9 million in the general school aids appropriation in 2012-13.
- ✓ *High Poverty Aid.* Eliminate high poverty aid and redirect the \$16.8 million in funding under the budget bill to the general school aids appropriation.
- ✓ *Low-Income Pupil Weighting.* Specify that each pupil eligible for federal free- or reduced-price lunch would be weighted by an additional 20% (in other words, be counted as 1.2 pupil rather than 1.0 pupil) for purposes of the membership count used in calculating equalized value per member under the general aid formula.
- ✓ *Minimum Aid.* Specify that every school district would receive at least \$3,000 per member in general aid.
- ✓ *Secondary Cost Ceiling.* Set the secondary cost ceiling at 100% of the prior year statewide shared cost per member, rather than 90% as under current law.
- ✗ ~~*Special Adjustment Aid.* Modify the bill provision under which special adjustment aid in 2011-12 only would be based on 90% (rather than 85% under current law) of a district's prior year general aid payment to make the 90% threshold permanent.~~ *already in*
- ✓ *Hold Harmless Aid.* Create a new general fund appropriation for hold harmless aid. For eligible districts, this aid would be paid in the amount needed to provide the district with the same amount of funding from general aid under the provisions of the motion in 2012-13 as they would have received from sum of general aid, the school levy credit, and high poverty aid under current law. Using the bill funding as the hold harmless base, an estimated \$23.1 million would need to be appropriated for this aid in 2012-13.

Note:

The additional aid under this motion would be under revenue limits. As a result, school district property tax levies would be reduced in an amount equivalent to the additional aid provided.

WISCONSIN TECHNICAL COLLEGE SYSTEM

Increase Funding for Training Program Grants and Grants for High Demand Programs
[LFB Paper #805]

Motion:

20.292 (1) (eh)

Move to provide \$400,000 GPR annually for training program grants. Require that, beginning in 2011-12, the WTCS Board must award at least \$2,400,000 annually for advanced manufacturing skills training grants under training program grants. Provide that a business may not receive training under such a grant unless the business pays individuals trained under the grant, at the time of the training or no later than six months after completion of the training, at least 150% of the federal hourly minimum wage.

Move to provide \$10,000,000 GPR in 2011-12 and \$10,000,000 GPR in 2012-13 in a new appropriation under WTCS to award competitive grants for high-demand occupational programs, including nursing-related, welding, or other high-demand programs, as determined by the WTCS Board through regional employer surveys, labor market studies, program waiting lists, or other means.

Note:

Under current law, the WTCS Board must award at least \$2,000,000 annually for advanced manufacturing training program grants. Total funding is \$3,970,000 GPR annually, provided in a biennial appropriation.

Modifications to Choice Omnibus Motion #458

Motion:

Move to modify motion #458 as follows:

Payment and Reestimate (Paper #550). Delete the provision of the motion and bill to index the maximum choice payment to the change in the general school aid appropriation, if positive, beginning in 2013-14.

Family Income Limit (Paper #551). Delete the provisions of the motion and bill regarding the family income limit. Instead, specify that the eligibility threshold for the program would be set at the highest family income level for which the state receives federal matching funds for health care services provided to children under the age of 19 under the state's BadgerCare Plus program.

School Eligibility (Paper #551). Delete the provisions of the motion and bill regarding school eligibility. Current law would be maintained.

Pupil Participation Limit (Paper #551). Delete the provision of the motion and bill regarding the pupil participation limits. Current law would be maintained.

Combined Fiscal Effect (Paper #551). Delete the provision of the motion and bill regarding the fiscal effect of the proposed expansion. Instead, provide \$3,968,300 in 2011-12 and \$7,936,500 in 2012-13 in high poverty aid. (These amounts are equal to the net GPR effect of the expansion.)

Required Tests (Paper #552). Delete the provision of the motion specifying how DPI calculates the percentage of choice students at each proficiency level on the WKCE.

Going Concerns Determination. Delete the provision of the motion deleting the bill provision on going concerns determination. (The provisions would be placed in statute.)

Background Checks. Require the State Superintendent with the assistance of the Department of Justice, annually by August 1, to ensure that each teacher and administrator employed by a choice school and each owner of a choice school be subject to the same criminal history and child abuse record search as is conducted with respect to a caregivers as required under s. 48.685(1)(ag)1. Prohibit a choice school from employing a person as a teachers or administrator or contract with a

person to serve as a teacher or administrator if the person would not be eligible or permitted to be employed, contracted with, or licensed for any of the reasons specified under s. 48.685. Specify that the State Superintendent may issue an order immediately terminate a choice school from participating if this provision is violated and that the State Superintendent notify the parent or guardian or each pupil attending the school for which an order is issued.

Special Education Pupils. Require each choice school to annually report to DPI on the number of students enrolled in the school for whom an individualized education program has been prepared.

Choice Program -- Participation of Disqualified Persons. Move to specify that the State Superintendent may issue an order barring a school from participating in the choice program in the current year if he or she determines that the school retains, whether for compensation or as a volunteer, a disqualified person as an owner, officer, director, trustee, administrator, administrator designee, or an individual with administrative, financial, or pupil health and safety responsibilities, whether compensated or uncompensated, before the end of a seven year period from the date of an order issued by the State Superintendent barring a school from participating in the choice program.

Define "disqualified person" as an individual who either: (a) had ownership interest in, or was an officer, director or trustee of a school at the time the school was barred or terminated from participation in the choice program; (b) was the administrator of the school or identified as an administrator designee of a school at the time the school was barred or terminated from participating in the program; or (c) was responsible for an action or circumstance that led to the school being barred or terminated from participation in the choice program.

Racine County Choice Program. Delete motion provisions creating the program. Delete \$1,610,500 in 2011-12 and \$3,221,000 in 2012-13 in the Racine program appropriation. Delete the resulting RUSD general aid reduction of \$618,400 in 2011-12 and \$1,236,900 in 2012-13. Delete the net general fund fiscal effect of \$992,100 in 2011-12 and \$1,984,100 in 2012-13.

- c. *Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Grants*. Provide \$4,361,800 GPR annually to restore base level funding for the alcohol and other drug abuse (AODA) grant program. Also restore AODA statutory language that would be deleted under the bill. w. 255(2)(d)
- d. *AODA Funding Reduction*. Provide \$142,800 PR annually to restore a 10% reduction from base level funding of \$1,427,500 PR for AODA programs. Program revenues are from penalty assessment funding.
- e. *Special Education Aid*. Provide \$4,012,500 GPR in 2011-12 and \$8,199,400 GPR in 2012-13 for special education aid, above base level funding of \$368,939,100.
- f. *Children-at-Risk*. Restore the children-at-risk program, with \$3,377,500 GPR annually to restore base level funding.
- g. *Smaller Categorical Aids*. Provide \$614,200 GPR annually to restore the following categorical aid programs that would be deleted under the bill: (a) grants for nursing services (\$241,200 annually); (b) supplemental aid (\$120,600 annually); (c) advanced placement grants (\$96,500 annually); (d) English for Southeast Asian pupils (\$96,500 annually); and (e) grants for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (\$59,400 annually). w. 28(47)

- h. *Gifted and Talented Education Grants*. Modify the current law grants program to also

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allow all University of Wisconsin campuses to receive grants. Under the bill, the University of Wisconsin-Madison, only, would be added as an eligible recipient. Under current law, nonprofit organizations, cooperative educational service agencies, and Milwaukee Public Schools can receive grants.
