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WEDC – POSSIBLE AMENDMENTS

SUBSTITUTES

1. Draft Substitute Amendment removing all provisions of the bill. Insert creation of charter agency authority, based on 2003 Iowa law, for Department of Commerce. (Copy of Iowa law attached, pg 9-12). Include no appropriation language.
2. Draft substitute amendment removing all appropriations language; retain all other language as originally drafted. (Intent is to make bill not subject to line-item veto.)

NEW BILL DRAFT

1. Redraft removed language (appropriations language, include modification intent in below simple amendment) into bill draft (special session)

SIMPLES – Modify current language

1. Section 9155 -- Draft simple to require Passive Review by Joint Finance of the DOA Secretary's transfer of appropriations and position authority. Include language limiting transfer authority to the following subsections: 201.143 (1) and no more than 75% of the appropriations in 20.143 (4). Also require Commerce to retain federal funds in 20.143 (4) (m-o) in accordance with federal law, thereby allowing transfer only if the funds are directly related to the functions of the WEDC.

SIMPLES - New Additions to the Bill

1. Draft simple amendment to the bill that includes in 13.94 (4)(a)(1) the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (prefer the actual wording rather than the chapter 238 cross-reference.)
2. Draft a simple amendment to the bill that requires the WEDC to develop a plan that will ensure to return a portion of excess proceeds held by the WEDC to the general fund of Wisconsin. Further require the Joint Committee on Finance to introduce the plan in statutory language by Jan 1, 2012.
3. Draft a simple amendment that is a statement of goals by the Legislature and Governor for business development:
 - i. Goal of 50% of all incentives and ED programs be targeted and awarded to small business employing less than 100 employees
 - ii. Goal of 5% all incentives and ED programs be targeted and awarded to certified minority owned business (current certification standards)

- iii. Goal of 5% all incentives and ED programs be targeted and awarded to certified women owned businesses (current certification standards)
 - iv. Goal of 5% all incentives and ED programs be targeted and awarded to certified disabled veterans owned businesses (current certification standards)
4. Draft a simple amendment that requires that Any Economic development program or incentive given to a company or organization must include contractual obligations for the jobs that are created to remain in Wisconsin for at least 4 years after creation of the position

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SENATE AMENDMENT,
TO SENATE BILL 6

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 1. Page 22, line 9: after that line insert:

3 “(3) DEVELOPMENT OF PLAN TO RETURN EXCESS PROCEEDS FROM ECONOMIC
4 DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS TO THE GENERAL FUND. Before September 1, 2011, the board
5 of the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation shall develop a plan to pay
6 excess proceeds from economic development and other programs developed and
7 implemented by the board to the general fund and shall submit the plan to the
8 cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance. Before January 1, 2012, the joint
9 committee on finance shall introduce legislation to implement the plan.”
