Rick –

Please draft the following amendments to the versions of SS SB 6 and SS AB 6 that will be on the Senate Floor tomorrow:

1. Identical to a0239/1, except specify that the executive director of WEDC may not be employed at the same time by a state agency.
2. Identical to a0236/1
3. Identical to a0278/1
4. An amendment to require Commerce to send written notice to any entity either currently funded by Commerce if it will lose funding as a result of the transfer of funds to WEDC; and to any entity currently in negotiation with Commerce if programs involved in those negotiations are to be defunded as the result of the transfer.
5. An amendment to prohibit the transfer of funds under the bill until the Legislature creates ethics provisions for WEDC employees that are at least as stringent as those currently required of Commerce. (Background: apparently the bill can't currently be amended to extend public service ethics requirements beyond the executive director and board members because WEDC has no staff structure yet. The idea behind the amendment is that the structure would have to be created and a statute adopted that requires ethics and financial reporting requirements for the same levels of administrative staff as Commerce before DOA can transfer funds).

TO SENATE BILL 6

substitute amendment

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At the locations indicated, amend the ~~bill~~ as follows:

1. Page 24, line 14 after that line insert:

"238.08 Grants, awards, or loan. In determining whether to make a grant, award, or loan to any person for funding any project under an economic development program established by the board, the board shall consider all of the following:

- (1) Whether the project serves a public purpose.
- (2) Whether the project will retain or increase employment in this state.
- (3) Whether the project might not occur without the grant, award, or loan.
- (4) Whether financial support is available from another source on reasonably equivalent terms.
- (5) The extent to which the project will be financed with funds not provided by this state.

1 **(6)** Whether funds from a grant, award, or loan will be used to pay overhead
2 costs or to replace funds from another source.

3 **(7)** Whether the project will displace workers in this state.

4 **(8)** The extent to which the project will retain or increase the number of
5 full-time jobs, as defined in s. 560.70 (2m), in this state.

6 **(9)** The extent to which the project will contribute to the economic growth of
7 this state and the well-being of the residents of this state.

8 **(10)** Whether the project will be located in an area of high unemployment or
9 low average income.

10 **(11)** The financial soundness of the eligible recipient.

11 **(12)** The intention of the eligible recipient to repay a grant, award, or loan.

12 **(13)** The economic condition of the community in which the project is proposed
13 to occur.

14 **(14)** The potential of the project to promote the employment of minority group
15 members.

16 **(15)** The potential of the project to promote businesses owned by women,
17 minority group members, veterans, or disabled veterans.

18 **(16)** The potential of the project to promote the development of
19 high-technology industry in this state.

20 **(17)** The potential of the project to promote the development of renewable
21 energy technology industry in this state.

22 **(18)** The potential of the project to strengthen the state's traditional core
23 industries or promote expansion of an emerging industry.
