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### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Current law requires the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to administer a safe drinking water program and to establish all safeguards that DNR determines to be necessary in protecting public health from impure drinking water supplies. DNR has promulgated a rule that requires municipal drinking water systems to provide continuous disinfection of the water that they provide, beginning no later than December 1, 2013.

This bill prohibits DNR from requiring a municipal water system to provide continuous disinfection of the water that it provides, unless continuous disinfection is required under federal law.

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*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

3 SECTION 1. 281.17 (8) of the statutes is renumbered 281.17 (8) (a).

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 1, line 2: after "supplies" insert "and ranking projects for the safe  
3 drinking water loan program".

4 **2.** Page 2, line 3: delete that line and substitute "that it provides, unless one  
5 of the following applies:".

6 **3.** Page 2, line 3: after that line insert:

AA1-3

7 "1. Continuous disinfection is required under federal law.

8 2. Water quality data, well construction, or water system construction indicate  
9 a potential health hazard.

10 **SECTION 2m.** 281.61 (6) of the statutes is amended to read:

11 281.61 (6) PRIORITY LIST. The department shall establish a priority list that  
12 ranks each safe drinking water loan program project. The department shall  
13 promulgate rules for determining project rankings that, to the extent possible, give

1 priority to projects that address the most serious risks to human health, that are  
2 necessary to ensure compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 USC 300f to  
3 300j-26, and that assist local governmental units that are most in need on a per  
4 household basis, according to affordability criteria specified in the rules. For the  
5 purpose of ranking projects under this subsection, the department shall treat a  
6 project to upgrade a public water system to provide continuous disinfection of the  
7 water that it distributes as if the public water system were a surface water system  
8 that federal law requires to provide continuous disinfection.”
