Senate Substitute Amendment

Take LRBs0100/1 and make the following changes –

- 1) Permit a signed affidavit to be used in place of a photo identification card. Provide that the individual that falsifies his/her affidavit he/she would be guilty of a felony crime.
 - 2) Maintain the current law 10 day residency requirement for registration, rather than the 28 days provided under the bill.
 - 3) A student identification card, in its current form, from any accredited institution of higher education shall serve as a valid identification card for the purpose of voting. Require that the expiration date on the card be set for 4 years.
 - 4) Any voter age 65 and older and has resided at the same address for the previous 2 presidential elections shall not be required to produce a photo identification for the purpose of voting.
 - 5) For the spring primary and general elections and the fall primary and general elections, require that each DMV office be open at least once a week in the 2 months prior to the election.

- 8) No photo identification is required if you are requesting a ballot by mail or in-person (LRB 0887/1) (Erpenbach)
- 9) No identification card fee for qualified electors; notice on application of fee exemption for qualified electors. (LRB 0921/1)
