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


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Senate Substitute Amendment

Take LRBs0100/1 and make the following changes –

- 1) Permit a signed affidavit to be used in place of a photo identification card.
Provide that the individual that falsifies his/her affidavit he/she would be guilty of a felony crime.
 - 2) Maintain the current law 10 day residency requirement for registration, rather than the 28 days provided under the bill.
 - 3) A student identification card, in its current form, from any accredited institution of higher education shall serve as a valid identification card for the purpose of voting. Require that the expiration date on the card be set for 4 years.
 - 4) Any voter age 65 and older and has resided at the same address for the previous 2 presidential elections shall not be required to produce a photo identification for the purpose of voting.
 - 5) For the spring primary and general elections and the fall primary and general elections, require that each DMV office be open at least once a week in the 2 months prior to the election.

Draft as Senate Simple Amendments

- 1) Permit a signed affidavit to be used in place of a photo identification card.
Provide that the individual that falsifies his/her affidavit he/she would be guilty of a felony crime.
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- 3) Any voter age 65 and older and has resided at the same address for the previous 2 presidential elections shall not be required to produce a photo identification for the purpose of voting.

For the spring primary and general elections and the fall primary and general elections, require that each DMV office be open at least once a week in the 2 months prior to the election.

Senate Substitute Amendment to ASA 2 AB 7

Take LRBs0100/1 and make the following changes –

- 1) Permit a signed affidavit to be used in place of a photo identification card.
Provide that the individual that falsifies his/her affidavit he/she would be guilty of a felony crime. (Holperin)
- 2) Maintain the current law 10 day residency requirement for registration, rather than the 28 days provided under the bill. (Carpenter)
- 3) An unexpired identification card approved by the board that is issued by a university or college in this state that is accredited or a technical college.
(Carpenter) – From LRB a0877/1 add (g) – an unexpired identification card issued by a state agency or a local governmental unit (Erpenbach)
- 4) Any voter age 65 and older and has resided at the same address for the previous 2 presidential elections shall not be required to produce a photo identification for the purpose of voting.
- 5) Availability of DMV service stations (LRB 0919/1)
- 6) Make an appropriation for administration of elections, ethics and lobbying laws for voter identification information and implementation. LRB a0880/1
(Erpenbach)
- 7) Permit corroboration of an elector by another elector of the same municipality, if that elector providing the corroboration shall provide proof of residence under 6.34 (LRB a0879/1) (Erpenbach)
- 8) No photo identification is required if you are requesting a ballot by mail or in-person (LRB 0887/1) (Erpenbach)
- 9) No identification card fee for qualified electors; notice on application of fee exemption for qualified electors. (LRB 0921/1)

6.79 (8) ELECTORS WHO ARE AT LEAST 65 YEARS OF AGE. The inspectors shall enter on their poll list next to the name of each such elector the word "exempt.".

4 "SECTION 116g. 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 343.16 (3) (a) The department shall examine every applicant for the renewal
6 of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method
7 of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each
8 applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The
9 examination shall consist of a test of eyesight. The department shall make
10 provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all
11 applicants for an operator's license. All examining stations shall be open for business
12 until at least 8 p.m. on each election day and on the day immediately prior to each

1 election day. The person to be examined shall appear at the examining station
2 nearest the person's place of residence or at such time and place as the department
3 designates in answer to an applicant's request. In lieu of examination, the applicant
4 may present or mail to the department a report of examination of the applicant's
5 eyesight by an ophthalmologist, optometrist, or physician licensed to practice
6 medicine. The report shall be based on an examination made not more than 3 months
7 prior to the date it is submitted. The report shall be on a form furnished and in the
8 form required by the department. The department shall decide whether, in each
9 case, the eyesight reported is sufficient to meet the current eyesight standards.

10 **SECTION 116h.** 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes, as affected by 2007 Wisconsin Act
11 20 and 2011 Wisconsin Act (this act), is repealed and recreated to read:

12 343.16 (3) (a) Except as provided in s. 343.165 (4) (d), the department shall
13 examine every applicant for the renewal of an operator's license once every 8 years.
14 The department may institute a method of selecting the date of renewal so that such
15 examination shall be required for each applicant for renewal of a license to gain a
16 uniform rate of examinations. The examination shall consist of a test of eyesight.
17 The department shall make provisions for giving such examinations at examining
18 stations in each county to all applicants for an operator's license. All examining
19 stations shall be open for business until at least 8 p.m. on each election day and on
20 the day immediately prior to each election day. The person to be examined shall
