1. Sen. Coggs would like an amendment drafted that would require each county to have at least one DMV office that is open five days a week. In addition, the amendment (or a separate amendment) would require that counties 500 square miles in size or greater have two DMV offices.

SENATE AMENDMENT, TO 2011 ASSEMBLY BILL 7

At the locations indicated, amend the bill, as shown by assembly substitute amendment 2, as follows:

1. Page 65, line 15: after that line insert:

"Section 116g. 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.16 (3) (a) The department shall examine every applicant for the renewal of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The examination shall consist of a test of eyesight. The department shall make provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all applicants for an operator's license.) At least

343.16 (3) (a) Except as provided in s. 343.165 (4) (d), the department shall examine every applicant for the renewal of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The examination shall consist of a test of eyesight. The department shall make provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all applicants for an operator's license.
