#### DOT-related amendment

1. Sen. Coggs would like an amendment drafted that would require each county to have at least one DMV office that is open five days a week. In addition, the amendment (or a separate amendment) would require that counties 500 square miles in size or greater have two DMV offices.

4 "SECTION 116g. 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 343.16 (3) (a) The department shall examine every applicant for the renewal  
6 of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method  
7 of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each  
8 applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The  
9 examination shall consist of a test of eyesight. The department shall make  
10 provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all

The person to be examined shall appear at the examining station nearest the person's place of residence or at such time and place as the department designates in answer to an applicant's request. In lieu of examination, the applicant may present or mail to the department a report of examination of the applicant's eyesight by an ophthalmologist, optometrist, or physician licensed to practice medicine. The report shall be based on an examination made not more than 3 months prior to the date it is submitted. The report shall be on a form furnished and in the form required by the department. The department shall decide whether, in each case, the eyesight reported is sufficient to meet the current eyesight standards.

**SECTION 116h.** 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes, as affected by 2007 Wisconsin Act 20 and 2011 Wisconsin Act .... (this act), is repealed and recreated to read:

343.16 (3) (a) Except as provided in s. 343.165 (4) (d), the department shall examine every applicant for the renewal of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The examination shall consist of a test of eyesight.

The department shall make provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all applicants for an operator's license.

~~At least one examining station in each county shall be open for business on each Saturday and until at least 9 p.m. on at least one other day of each week. Examining stations in each county where any election is held shall be open for business until at least 9 p.m.~~
