Mark,

As I indicated in my voice message to you, Senator Wangaard is requesting an amendment to SB 274, relating to sales of bulk plastic merchandise containers to scrap dealers. The intent is to expand the definition of "bulk plastic merchandise container" to apply to containers, as described, for all grocery items, not just bottled beverages. The grocers association is OK with this idea, but concerned that bottled beverages not be lost under a new, broader term. For this reason, they request that the amendment revise the definition of "bulk plastic merchandise container" to refer to "grocery items, including retail containers of bottled beverages." (See below.)

Please note that the bill is scheduled for executive action in the Senate Committee on Judiciary, etc., at 11:00 on Wednesday. I believe that Senator Zipperer observes a 24-hour rule on amendments, meaning that Senator Wangaard would need the amendment before 11:00 tomorrow (Tuesday).

Craig,

Either should work, though I like the second option better. I don't think we need to define "grocery item" -- it is a generally understood term, and a definition could unnecessarily limit the application of this law.

My problem with the first option is that it introduces the term "packaged grocery item." While the meaning is probably clear enough without defintion, I wonder if it would miss some of the universe you are trying to catch -for example, if produce were delivered in plastic crates but not individually packaged, those crates would not be covered.

Would WBA be agreeable to an amendment suggested by Leg. Council to change the definition of "plastic bulk merchandise container" from "...the bulk transport or storage of retail containers of <u>bottled beverages</u>" to "...the bulk transport or storage of retail containers of <u>grocery items</u>."

Grocery is not specifically defined in statute. However, this would allow the inclusion of plastic crates for other groceries besides bottled beverages, such as baked goods used by grocers.
