Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB-143 would provide for an additional method, as allowed by federal law, for Wisconsin to qualify for an Extended Benefits "on" period. Under current federal law, the employer share of extended benefits is paid by the federal government for claims filed before January 4, 2012. However, the employer portion, where the employer is a state or local government entity, or an Indian tribal entity, is not paid by the federal government.

The Department of Workforce Development estimates that enactment of this additional method to qualify for an Extended Benefit "on" period would result in approximately \$43 million in benefits paid to unemployed Wisconsin residents from the date of enactment through the remainder of the 2011 calendar year. This estimate is based upon DWD and DOR economic projections.

Of the \$43 million projection, DWD estimates that approximately \$389,000 will be charged to state and local government units. See Fiscal Estimate Worksheet for details.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Under current federal law, federal funding for the employer portion of Extended Benefits ends at the close of 2011, so no long range fiscal implications are anticipated.

I. One-time Costs or Revenue Impacts for State and/or Local Government (do not include in annualized fiscal effect):		
Under current law, federal funding of the employer share of Extended Benefits expires at the end of calendar year 2011. As a result, all estimated fiscal impact occurs only in the remainder of calendar year 2011, and there will be no ongoing annualized costs. DWD estimates the governmental unit share of the \$43 million in anticipated Extended Benefit payments will total approximately \$389,000 during the remainder of CY2011. Of this amount, approximately \$269,000 will be to local governmental units, while approximately \$119,000 will be to state government. Of the \$119,000 to state government, DWD estimates \$69,000 GPR, \$12,000 FED, \$26,000 PR, and \$12,000 SEG. Additionally, DWD estimates implementation costs to the UI Division of DWD to be approximately \$21,000.
