Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If implemented, the water treatment industry would not be regulated. This may result in an increased number of complaints of water treatment devices. If DSPS investigates these claims, it would result in increased cost to investigate. The amount cannot be determined. In addition, there would be one-time costs, which are detailed on the following page. There would also be a reduction in revenue of approximately \$28,000 annually. This revenue is currently received for the plan review revenue which would not be collected under this proposal.
