Mark, after looking through the drafts I only have a couple comments/questions:

- LRB 0919/P2 and the DN for that draft, the reference under proposed s. 16.9647 (2) (i) and in the last paragraph of the pref. note should be to the grants issued to PSAPs by OJA under LRB 0922. You might have a better way to word this, but the intent is for this section to be where the council gets the authority to tell the PSC at what rate to set the state 911 fee (subject to Gov. approval).

✓ LRB 0920/P2 looks good

- In LRB 0921/P2, page 6 lines 16-21, I didn't explain this very well. Please eliminate reference to a prior/subsequent order. If there is room under the cap (\$.40/.20 adjusted by CPI) they should be able to increase the fee regardless of whether it was ever previously reduced. I think that the only relevant provisions of this subdivision par. are that there is a cap, and what that cap is.

Also, since you made the changes related to the definition of "costs" to this bill and 0923, I think that we can remove section 18 from this bill.

- LRB 0922/P2 looks good

- In LRB 0923/P3, can you move the notes referencing the definitions of "911 service provider" and "communications provider" up to after the definition of "costs" where these terms are first used? Also, add "telecommunications" in the pref. note consistent with #1 of the DN on the P2.

With respect to the transitional provisions in the nonstat section, this is really looking good. A couple of things:

1. (2) (a) 5. and (b) should be revised to recognize that the contracting requirement in s. 256.35 (3f) (b) will probably entail multiple contracts with various entities that, together, will cover the whole state. So, maybe, use "state 911 service contracts" or something like that, and terminate duties under existing contracts "upon commencement of the provision of 911 telecommunications services under state 911 services contracts applicable to the county"?
2. We also need to modify the reimbursement for existing duties (section (2) (c)) to provide that the amount of reimbursement may not exceed the fees that the service provider would have collected under the charge levied by the county under s. 256.35 (3) (b). The key here is that reimbursements should not exceed the bill-and-keep amounts that they are currently getting per customer under current law.

1 AN ACT to create 15.107 (19), 16.9645 (2) (g) and 16.9647 of the statutes;
2 relating to: the creation of a state 911 council.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill is explained in the NOTES provided by the Joint Legislative Council in the bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the Joint Legislative Council's Special Committee on 911 Communications.

This bill creates a council to advise and direct the office of justice assistance (OJA) and the public service commission (PSC) on the administration of 911 telecommunications services and grant programs available to promote those services. The council works with and is supported by the OJA, and is attached for administrative purposes to the department of administration.

The bill outlines the membership of the council, which includes entities involved in various aspects of 911 telecommunications and emergency response issues. There are 15 members, appointed by the governor for staggered 3-year terms. The chairperson, vice chairperson, and secretary of the council are elected by the council at the first meeting of each year.

The duties of the council include advising the OJA and the PSC on the administration of 911 telecommunications services and associated grant and fee

✓ programs, conducting a statewide 911 telecommunications system assessment, developing recommendations for service standards for public safety answering points, establishing criteria for eligibility for ~~911 telecommunications service~~ grants, advising the OJA as to 911 telecommunications service standards, promoting interoperability and consolidation of public safety answering points statewide as appropriate, exploring additional funding sources for 911 communications, directing the PSC as to the amount of the fee required under 2013 Assembly Bill (LRB-0921/1) that is necessary to provide full cost recovery for statewide 911 telecommunications service under 2013 Assembly Bill (LRB-0923/1) and grants by OJA to public safety answering points under 2013 Assembly Bill (LRB-0922/1), and ensuring that the performance of these duties are done in such a manner so as not to favor one particular technology over another.

The bill also authorizes the creation of, and funding for, a 911 telecommunications service coordinator within OJA.

1 **SECTION 1.** 15.107 (19) of the statutes is created to read:

2 **15.107 (19) STATE 911 COUNCIL.** There is created a state 911 council, attached to
3 the department of administration under s. 15.03. When making appointments to the
4 council, the governor shall consider the geographical diversity of, and the
5 representation of urban and rural interests by, the membership of the council. The
6 council consists of the following members serving for staggered 3-year terms:

7 (a) An individual recommended by an association of Wisconsin cities, villages,
8 or towns.

9 (b) An individual recommended by an association of Wisconsin counties.

10 (c) An individual recommended by a Wisconsin association, or a Wisconsin
11 chapter of an association, that promotes a universal emergency telephone number
12 system.

13 (d) An individual recommended by an association of Wisconsin county sheriffs.

14 (e) Two individuals, each of whom represents a different commercial mobile
15 radio service provider, as defined in s. 196.01 (2g), operating in Wisconsin, one
16 serving a primarily regional market and one serving a national market.

17 (f) An individual recommended by a Wisconsin association, or a Wisconsin
18 chapter of an association, of public safety communications professionals.

6 (j) A fire chief recommended by an association of Wisconsin fire chiefs.

7 (k) An individual recommended by a Wisconsin association that promotes
8 emergency management.

9 (L) An individual who is a video service provider, as defined in s. 196.01 (12r).

10 (m) An individual recommended by a Wisconsin association of emergency
11 medical service providers.

12 **SECTION 2.** 16.9645 (2) (g) of the statutes is created to read:

13 16.9645 (2) (g) Coordinate with the state 911 council.

14 **SECTION 3.** 16.9647 of the statutes is created to read:

15 **16.9647 State 911 council.** (1) In this section:

16 (a) “Council” means the state 911 council.

17 (b) “Office” means the office of justice assistance.

18 (c) “Public safety answering point” has the meaning given in s. 256.35 (1) (gm).

19 (2) The council shall do all of the following:

20 (a) Advise the office and the public service commission on the administration
21 of 911 telecommunications services and associated grant programs.

22 (b) Conduct a statewide 911 telecommunications system assessment.

23 (c) Develop a statewide plan for 911 telecommunications services.

24 (d) Develop recommendations for service standards for public safety answering
25 points.

(e) Establish criteria for eligibility for ^{state} 911 telecommunications ~~service~~ grants and advise the office as to the standards the office develops under s. 16.964 (19). The criteria for eligibility shall include basic training standards and service standards.

(f) Promote, facilitate, and coordinate interoperability across all state public safety answering points with respect to telecommunications services and data systems, including geographic information systems.

(g) Promote, facilitate, and coordinate consolidation of public safety answering point functions where consolidation would provide improved service, increased efficiency, or cost savings.

4

(h) Seek funding from sources, including federal sources, for 911 telecommunications system enhancements, studies, and other purposes consistent with the duties of the council.

5

(i) Direct the public service commission under s. 256.35 (3) (cm) as to the amount of the fee required under s. 256.35 (3) (bm) which is necessary to provide full-cost recovery for statewide 911 telecommunications service under s. 256.35 (3f) and for grants under s. 16.964 (19) (b).

(j) Undertake all of its duties in a manner that is competitively and technologically neutral to all service providers.

7

(k) Coordinate with the interoperability council under s. 15.107 (18).

8

(L) Assist the office in identifying and obtaining funding to implement a statewide 911 telecommunication system.

9

(m) Advise the office on allocating any funds obtained under par. (L) for the purpose of achieving the goals under this subsection.
