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

We are sorry for the late submission of the 5 budget amendments in response to Governor Walker's proposal for the new state surplus, but we were still collecting information. Hopefully these will be straight forward.

There are five, possibly six separate amendments on the attached spreadsheet (the sixth is not complete yet), each in different areas of the budget. All proposals contain property tax relief (using 1<sup>st</sup> dollar funding) and money for the rainy day fund. We do not want to change the tax brackets, any of the AMT or net tax liability proposals in AB1 for the Special Session.

**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT ,  
TO 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 1**

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 1, line 11: after “rate;” insert “base wages paid to state employees and  
3 individuals providing services to the state pursuant to contract;”.

4 **2.** Page 3, line 1: before that line insert:

5 “**SECTION 1b.** 16.705 (1s) of the statutes is created to read:

6 16.705 (1s) (a) In this subsection:

7 1. “Contractor” means a person who provides services under a contract with the  
8 state under this subchapter, either directly or as a subcontractor.

9 2. “Employee” means an individual who is employed by a contractor to perform  
10 work under the contract.

11 (b) A contractor shall pay an employee for work performed under the contract  
12 an hourly base wage that is no less than \$11.”.

13 **3.** Page 3, line 1: delete “**SECTION 1**” and substitute “**SECTION 1r**”.

1           **4.** Page 16, line 25: after that line insert:

2           **“SECTION 43m.** 230.12 (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

3           230.12 (1) (b) *Schedules.* The several separate pay schedules may incorporate  
4           different wage and salary administration features. Each schedule shall provide for  
5           pay ranges or pay rates and applicable methods and frequency of within range pay  
6           adjustments based on such considerations as competitive practice, appropriate  
7           principles and techniques of wage and salary administration and determination,  
8           elimination of pay inequities based on gender or race, and the needs of the service.  
9           Not limited by enumeration, such considerations for establishment of pay rates and  
10          ranges and applicable within range pay adjustments may include provisions  
11          prevalent in schedules used in other public and private employment, professional or  
12          advanced training, recognized expertise, or any other criteria which assures state  
13          employee compensation is set on an equitable basis. No pay schedule may include  
14          a base wage of less than \$11 an hour.”.

18          (1) PAYMENT OF BASE WAGES TO STATE EMPLOYEES. Any state employee who is paid  
19          a base wage of less than \$11 an hour on the day before the effective date of this  
20          subsection shall immediately have his or her base wage increased to \$11 an hour.”.

21          **6.** Page 17, line 14: after that line insert:

22          **“SECTION 9301. Initial applicability; Administration.**

2           **SECTION 33.** 79.15 of the statutes is amended to read:

3           **79.15 Improvements credit.** The total amount paid each year to  
4 municipalities from the appropriation account under s. 20.835 (3) (b) for the  
5 payments under s. 79.10 (5m) is \$75,000,000 in 2009, \$145,000,000 in 2010, and  
6 \$150,000,000 in each year beginning in 2011 and ending in 2014, and \$650,000,000  
7 in 2015 and in each year thereafter. \$625,000,000

8           **SECTION 34.** 115.436 (2) (intro.) and (c) of the statutes are consolidated,  
9 renumbered 115.436 (2) and amended to read:

10           115.436 (2) A school district is eligible for sparsity aid under this section if it  
11 satisfies all of the following criteria: (c) ~~The~~ the school district's membership in the  
12 previous school year divided by the school district's area in square miles is less than

1 AN ACT **relating to:** payments to public employees affected by 2011 Wisconsin  
2 Act 10; increasing the amount of the first-dollar credit; transfers to the budget  
3 stabilization fund; and base wages paid to state employees and individuals  
4 providing services to the state pursuant to contract.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 16.705 (1s) of the statutes is created to read:

16.705 (1s) (a) In this subsection:

1. "Contractor" means a person who provides services under a contract with the state under this subchapter, either directly or as a subcontractor.

2. "Employee" means an individual who is employed by a contractor to perform work under the contract.

1           **SECTION 9101. Nonstatutory provisions; Administration.**

2           (1) PAYMENT OF MONEYS TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES AFFECTED BY 2011 WISCONSIN ACT 10.

3           The department of administration shall calculate the increase in retirement and  
4           other benefit contributions for public employees resulting from the enactment of  
5           2011 Wisconsin Act 10 before the effective date of this subsection. No later than 60  
6           days after the effective date of this subsection, the department shall pay to each  
7           public employee, from the appropriation account under section 20.505 (1) (ch) of the  
8           statutes, as created by this act, the amount that the employee was required to pay in  
9           increased retirement and other benefit contributions for public employees resulting  
10          from the enactment of 2011 Wisconsin Act 10.

11           **SECTION 9140. Nonstatutory provisions; State Employment Relations,**

13          (1) PAYMENT OF BASE WAGES TO STATE EMPLOYEES. Any state employee who is paid  
14          a base wage of less than \$11 an hour on the day before the effective date of this  
15          subsection shall immediately have his or her base wage increased to \$11 an hour.

16           **SECTION 9201. Fiscal changes; Administration.**

17          (1) TRANSFER TO BUDGET STABILIZATION FUND. Notwithstanding the amounts that  
18          are required to be transferred from the general fund to the budget stabilization fund  
19          during the 2013-15 fiscal biennium under section 16.518 (3) of the statutes, an  
20          amount equal to \$106,000,000 shall be transferred from the general fund to the  
21          budget stabilization fund during the 2013-14 fiscal year and an amount equal to 0  
22          shall be transferred from the general fund to the budget stabilization fund during the  
23          2014-15 fiscal year.
