Jeff,

Senator Risser would like a bill drafted to change several provisions of 2011 Act 23 (AB7) relating to election laws.

- 1) Act 23 increased the residency requirement to vote from 10 days to 28 days. Senator Risser would like to return to a 10 day residency requirement;
- 2) Act 23 moved up the deadline to register to vote in advance of election day from 5:00pm on the day before the election to 5:00pm on the Friday before the election. Senator Risser would like to return to allowing pre-registration up until the day before the election; and *(late register in person 6.29(2)(a))*
6.84(1)(b) Act 23 provides that an in-person application for absentee voting be allowed from the third Monday before an election until 5:00pm on the Friday before the election. Senator Risser would like to allow in-person applications for absentee voting to be submitted until 5:00pm on the day before the election.



Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain limited exceptions, an individual must be a resident of this state and of the municipality and ward, if any, where the individual will vote for 28 consecutive days before an election to be eligible to vote in the election. This bill decreases the durational residency requirement to 10 consecutive days. An individual who does not satisfy the 10 day residency requirement at his or her current location but who resided at another location in this state in the 9 day period preceding the election may vote absentee in the ward or municipality from which he or she moved if the individual is otherwise qualified to vote at that in that ward or municipality. ✓

Currently, the deadline for late registration made in person and at the office of a municipal clerk or board of election commissioners to vote in an election is 5 p.m. or the close of business, whichever is later, on the Friday before the election. Similarly, the deadline for absentee voting in person at the office of a municipal clerk or board of election commissioners is 5 p.m. or the close of business, whichever is later, on the Friday before the election. This bill moves both of these deadlines to the day before the election. ✓

SECTION 1. 6.02 of the statutes ^{is} amended to read:

6.02 Qualifications, general.

(1) Every U.S. citizen age 18 or older who has resided in an election district or ward for ~~28~~ ¹⁰ consecutive days before any election where the citizen offers to vote is an eligible elector.

(2) Any U.S. citizen age 18 or older who moves within this state later than ~~28~~ ¹⁰ days before an election shall vote at his or her previous ward or election district if the person is otherwise qualified. If the elector can comply with the ~~28-day~~ ^{10-day} residence requirement at the new address and is otherwise qualified, he or she may vote in the new ward or election district.

If the elector moves his or her residence later than ~~28~~ ¹⁰ days before an election, the elector shall vote in the elector's former ward or municipality if otherwise qualified to vote there.

1 registration or similar act the person elects to establish a residence elsewhere. If the
2 person has no parents and if the person has not registered elsewhere, the person's
3 residence shall be at the place that the person considered his or her residence in
4 preference to any other for at least ~~28~~¹⁰ consecutive days before an election. If this
5 place is within the municipality, the person is entitled to all the privileges and subject
6 to all the duties of other citizens having their residence there, including voting.

13 clerk, or deputy clerk to sign his or her name, affirming that the deputy, inspector,
14 clerk, or deputy clerk has accepted the form. The form shall include a space for entry
15 of the ward and aldermanic district, if any, where the elector resides and any other
16 information required to determine the offices and referenda for which the elector is
17 certified to vote. The form shall also include a space where the clerk may record an
18 indication of whether the form is received by mail, a space where the clerk may record
19 an indication of the type of identifying document submitted by the elector as proof



Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, with certain limited exceptions, an individual must be a resident of this state and of the municipality and ward, if any, where the individual will vote for 28 consecutive days before an election to be eligible to vote in the election. This bill decreases the durational residency requirement to ten consecutive days. An individual who does not satisfy the ten-day residency requirement at his or her current location but who resided at another location in this state in the nine-day period preceding the election may vote absentee in the ward or municipality from which he or she moved if the individual is otherwise qualified to vote in that ward or municipality.

Currently, the deadline for late registration made in person and at the office of a municipal clerk or board of election commissioners to vote in an election is 5 p.m. or the close of business, whichever is later, on the Friday before the election. The deadline for absentee voting in person at the office of a municipal clerk or board of election commissioners is also 5 p.m. or the close of business, whichever is later, on

the Friday before the election. This bill moves both of these deadlines to the day before the election.

22 election; you have not made any bet or wager or become directly or indirectly
23 interested in any bet or wager depending upon the result of this election; you are not
24 on any other ground disqualified to vote at this election.”. If the person challenged
25 refuses to take the oath or affirmation, the person’s vote shall be rejected. If the

1 person challenged answers fully all relevant questions put to the elector by the board
2 of absentee ballot canvassers under s. 6.92, takes the oath or affirmation, and fulfills
3 the applicable registration requirements, and if the answers to the questions given
4 by the person indicate that the person meets the voting qualification requirements,
5 the person's vote shall be received.

6 **SECTION 17. Initial applicability.**

7 (1) ABSENTEE VOTING. The treatment of section 6.86 (1) (b) of the statutes first
8 applies to requests for absentee ballots made for voting at elections on the effective
9 date of this subsection.

10 (2) DEADLINE FOR LATE REGISTRATION. The treatment of section 6.29 (2) (a) of the
11 statutes first applies to late registration for voting at elections on the effective date
12 of this subsection.
