
We'd like to have a bill drafted that would create a new specialty license plate honoring Wisconsin's connection to the US Olympic Committee.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, ~~any~~^a group or organization may apply to the Department of Transportation (DOT) for designation as an authorized special group. If the application is approved, members of the authorized special group may obtain special distinguishing registration plates for certain vehicles, including automobiles and motor homes, that are owned or leased by special group members. A fee, in addition to the regular registration fee for the particular kind of vehicle, is charged for the issuance or reissuance of most special plates.

Before October 2, 1998, authorized special groups whose members may obtain special plates were specifically enumerated in state law. With certain exceptions, current law provides that specific enumeration in state law of authorized special groups is limited to those special groups enumerated before October 2, 1998.

This bill establishes an authorized special group specifically enumerated in state law for persons interested in obtaining special plates honoring this state's connection to the United States Olympic Committee. In addition to the regular vehicle registration fee, special group members are required to pay a \$15 fee for issuance or reissuance of the special plates and a \$25 annual fee that provides funds in equal amounts to Pettit National Ice Center, Inc., the Central Cross Country Ski Association, and the United States Olympic Committee. The bill requires the special plates to display a logo or symbol associated with the United States Olympic



12 logo associated with Harley-Davidson, Inc., on the left portion of the plates and the
13 words "share the road" on the bottom portion of the plates. Special group plates
14 under par. (f) 63. shall display a logo or symbol associated with the United States
15 Olympic Committee or the Olympic Games. Notwithstanding par. (e), special group
16 plates under par. (f) 33m. and 48m. shall be the same color and design that was
17 specified by the department for special group plates under par. (f) 33. and 48.,
18 respectively, immediately prior to January 1, 2007. The design for special group
19 plates under par. (f) 33. and 48. shall be different from the design of special group
20 plates under par. (f) 33m. and 48m., respectively.

21 **SECTION 6.** 341.14 (6r) (f) 63. of the statutes is created to read:

22 341.14 (6r) (f) 63. Persons interested in obtaining a plate honoring this state's
23 connection to the United States Olympic Committee.

24 **SECTION 7.** 341.14 (6r) (fm) 7. of the statutes, as affected by 2011 Wisconsin Act
25 32, is amended to read:

1 341.14 **(6r)** (fm) 7. After October 1, 1998, additional authorized special groups
2 may only be special groups designated by the department under this paragraph. The
3 authorized special groups enumerated in par. (f) shall be limited solely to those
4 special groups specified under par. (f) on October 1, 1998. This subdivision does not
5 apply to the special groups specified under par. (f) 3m., 6m., 9g., 9m., 12g., 12m., 15m.,
6 19m., 33m., 48m., 49d., 49h., 49s., 54., 55., 55m., 56., 57., 58., 59., 60., 61., 61m., and
7 61r., and 63.

8 **SECTION 8.** 341.14 (10) of the statutes is created to read:

9 341.14 **(10)** (a) Subject to par. (c), from the appropriation under s. 20.395 (5)
10 (ei), the department shall make payments to all of the following, in amounts as equal
11 as possible:

- 12 1. Pettit National Ice Center, Inc.
- 13 2. The Central Cross Country Ski Association.
- 14 3. The United States Olympic Committee.

15 (b) For each year in which the department makes payments to it under par. (a),
16 Pettit National Ice Center, Inc., the Central Cross Country Ski Association, and the
17 United States Olympic Committee shall submit to the presiding officer of each house
18 of the legislature an audited financial statement of its use of the payments under this
19 subsection, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

20 (c) The department shall discontinue payments to any recipient identified in
21 this subsection if the recipient dissolves, becomes insolvent, files a petition for
22 bankruptcy, or is no longer exempt from taxation under section 501 (a) of the Internal
23 Revenue Code.

24 (d) 1. If the special group plates under sub. (6r) (f) 63. will display any logo,
25 trademark or service mark, trade name, or other commercial symbol associated with

1 the Olympic Games or the United States Olympic Committee, the department may
2 not issue any plates under sub. (6r) (f) 63. unless the approval specified in sub. (6r)
3 (b) 1. for these plates provides for all of the following:

4 a. That the approval is irrevocable with respect to all plates issued for vehicles
5 after the plates are issued for these vehicles.

6 b. That, if the approval is withdrawn, the department may continue to renew
7 the registration of vehicles previously issued plates under sub. (6r) (f) 63., without
8 replacing those plates, but the department shall discontinue charging the fee
9 specified in sub. (6r) (b) 15. with respect to these renewals.

10 2. Notwithstanding sub. (6r) (b) 1. and (f) (intro.), if the approval specified in
11 sub. (6r) (b) 1. for plates issued under sub. (6r) (f) 63. is withdrawn, the department
12 shall discontinue issuing plates under sub. (6r) (f) 63. unless additional approval, as
13 specified in this paragraph and sub. (6r) (b) 1., is obtained by the department.

14 **SECTION 9. Nonstatutory provisions.**

15 (1) Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) (e) of the statutes, if this subsection takes
16 effect in fiscal year 2012-13, in submitting information under section 16.42 of the
17 statutes for purposes of the 2013-15 biennial budget bill, the department of
18 transportation shall submit information concerning the appropriation under section
19 20.395 (5) (cq) of the statutes as though the total amount appropriated under section
20 20.395 (5) (cq) of the statutes for the 2012-13 fiscal year was \$23,700 less than the
21 total amount that was actually appropriated under section 20.395 (5) (cq) of the
22 statutes for the 2012-13 fiscal year.

23 **SECTION 10. Fiscal changes.**

24 (1) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation
25 to the department of transportation under section 20.395 (5) (cq) of the statutes, as

1 affected by the acts of 2011, the dollar amount is increased by \$23,700 for the fiscal
2 year in which this subsection takes effect to increase funding for special registration
3 plates honoring this state's connection to the United States Olympic Committee.

4 **SECTION 11. Effective date.**

5 (1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 7th month beginning after
6 publication.
