What is that district's limit, the amount it levied in 2011 or the amount specified in its resolution?

Peter,
The draft should set the limit at the higher of the two years. The problem is that some districts lowered their levy last year because they had some extra money to cover a portion of the expense. Now they are stuck with the lower amount but don't have the extra money to cover the difference.

Hi Tim,

I understand the second part of your request, but am having a problem with the first part. Did the district levy more in 2011 than in 2012, and therefore want its limit to be the amount levied in 2011? If so, should the provision allow school districts the greater of the two amounts? In other words, current law sets the limit at the amount levied in the most recent year in which the district levied for fund 80. This bill would set the limit at the amount levied in the most recent year in which it levied for fund 80 or, if the district levied more in 2011 than in 2012 for fund 80, the higher of the amount levied in the most recent year in which it levied for fund 80 or the amount levied for fund 80 in 2011.

Let me know if that sounds right or if I'm missing something.





The 2013-15 biennial budget act limits the amount that a school district may levy for such community programs and activities in 2013 and 2014 to the amount that it levied for community programs and services in the most recent year in which it levied for community programs and services. ^{prior to 2013}

This bill provides two exceptions to the limit described above:

1. If a school board levied more for community programs and services in 2011 than it levied for that purpose in 2012, its limit is the amount it levied for community programs and services in 2011.

2. If a school board ^{voted} adopted a resolution before ^{July} June 1, 2013, ~~in which it expressed its intent to levy a specified amount for~~ community programs and services in 2013, its limit is the amount ~~specified in the resolution~~ ^{specified in the plan}.

The bill also provides that if both exceptions apply to a school district, its limit is the amount ~~specified in the resolution~~ ^{specified in the plan}.
