**Subject:** Budget White Paper – Delete Appropriations Not Used by DSPS

1. Summary of Proposed Budget Provision

The Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) budget contains several appropriations that were transferred from the former Department of Commerce. The programs either did not transfer to DSPS or are duplicates of other appropriations used therefore the appropriations are not needed.

Legislative approval will be needed to update Chapter 20 so that the unused or duplicate appropriations may be deleted.

2. Rationale

This is an administrative housekeeping request.

Removal of the unused, incorrect, or duplicate programs from Chapter 20 will present a more accurate listing of the programs appropriated and carried out by DSPS.

20.165(2) Regulation of Industry, Safety and Buildings:

a) (2)(pz) *Indirect cost reimbursements*. All monies received from the federal government relating to the regulation of industry, buildings, and safety, as reimbursement of indirect costs of grants and contracts for the purposes authorized in s. 16.54(9)(b). (Fund 100, numeric appropriation 245) DSPS is using 20.165(1)(pz) – Appr 154 for indirect cost reimbursements. This Appr 245 exists for the exact same purpose as Appr 154. Two indirect cost reimbursement appropriations are not needed.

b) In the budget system, the following appropriation numbers should be deleted:

- Appr 122 *Sale of materials and services* is the same as Appr 138 (1)(kc). Appr 122 does not appear in Chapter 20;
- Appr 268 *Brownfields redev; admin* is not used by DSPS nor does it appear in Chapter 20.

3. Statutes Affected and/or Proposed Statutory Language Modification

Wisconsin State Statute Chapter 20.165 (2)(pz) will need to be deleted.

4. Administrative Significance

Removing the duplicate or unnecessary appropriations will eliminate confusion and provide for a more concise listing of program appropriations.

5. Fiscal Effect

There is no fiscal effect. Additional spending authority is not required.

Pros: The department budget will be more concise.
