DMHSAS: Chapter 46, Wis. Stat.

1. In the 2007-09 biennial budget the Department of Health Services underwent a reorganization of the Division of Disability and Elder Services. The result was the creation of two new Divisions: the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (DMHSAS) and the Division of Long Term Care (DLTC).
2. Chapter 20 statutes and funding related to programs designated to DMHSAS were moved into a new program, alpha and numeric level under 20.435 (5), while funding and programs designated to DLTC remained in the existing program, alpha and numeric level, 20.435 (7).
3. While most appropriation references were updated in the statutes to reflect this reorganization, several outdated references remain in statute, directing programs administered by DMHSAS to be paid from DLTC appropriations. This does not reflect existing DHS organization or appropriation structure.
4. The following statutory appropriation references refer to DLTC appropriations but are paid from DMHSAS appropriations:
 - 46.48 (30) Substance Abuse Treatment Grants
 - 46.52 Systems change grants
 - 46.53 Mental health treatment provider training
 - 46.54 Consumer and family self-help and peer-supported programs
 - 46.55 (3m) Grants for services to persons in treatment
 - 46.86 (1), (2m)(b), (3m), (5), and (6)(a) Treatment programs
5. The Department could request statutory language changes to accurately reflect the existing appropriation structure. This would clarify the appropriation funding source for DMHSAS administered programs.

Technical Statutory Changes

Decision Needed

Should the Department request statutory language changes to update outdated statutory language appropriation references?

Background

The Department of Health Services (DHS) requests statutory language changes related to Chapter 20 appropriations in the Divisions of Public Health, Long Term Care and Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. Specifically, DHS requests statutory language changes to: 1) permit the Department of Revenue (DOR) to distribute moneys designated to the Red Cross through an income tax checkoff directly to the Badger Chapter of the American Red Cross; 2) bring the language in compliance with federal regulations governing the Birth to Three program; and 3) update appropriation references in Chapter 46, Wis. Stat to reflect existing DHS appropriation structure.

Current Language

Red Cross Checkoff

256.125 American Red Cross, Badger Chapter. The department shall distribute the moneys appropriated under s. 20.435 (1) (gd) to the Badger Chapter of the American Red Cross for use through that organization's Wisconsin Disaster Relief Fund.

71.10 (5k) (i) Appropriations. From the moneys received from designations for the Badger Chapter, an amount equal to the sum of administrative expenses, including data processing costs, certified under par. (h) 1. shall be deposited in the general fund and credited to the appropriation account under s. 20.566 (1) (hp), and the net amount remaining that is certified under par. (h) 3. shall be credited to the appropriation under s. 20.435 (1) (gd).

Birth to Three

51.44 (1m) The department is the lead agency in this state for the development and implementation of a statewide system of coordinated, comprehensive multidisciplinary programs to provide appropriate early intervention services under the requirements of 20 USC 1476.

51.44 (5) 3. (c) Annually, submit to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) a report on the department's progress toward full implementation

of the program under this section, including the progress of counties in implementing goals for participation in 5th-year requirements under 20 USC 1476.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau (S)

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Under current law, DHS has a series of appropriation to pay expenditures related to mental health and alcoholism or other drug abuse (AODA) programs and services. DHS also currently has a series of appropriations to pay expenditures related to long-term care services. This bill corrects the references to the appropriation accounts for the substance abuse treatment grants, systems change grants, mental health treatment provider training, consumer and family self-help and peer-support programs, grants for services to persons in AODA treatment, and AODA treatment programs for certain individuals so those expenditures are paid from the appropriation accounts related to mental health and AODA programs and services instead of the appropriation accounts related to long-term care.
