2 **1.** Page 64, line 15: after that line insert:

3 **“SECTION 24c.** 13.48 (39i) of the statutes is created to read:

4 13.48 (39i) FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER. (a) The legislature finds and determines
5 that domestic violence affects families, especially women and children, throughout
6 all communities in Wisconsin and that coordinating and centralizing victim and
7 victim advocacy services in communities would greatly benefit state residents. It is
8 therefore in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to aid in the
9 construction of a facility, to be located in the city of Milwaukee, to coordinate and
10 centralize victim and victim advocacy services for families affected by domestic
11 violence.

1 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$10,625,000 in general fund
2 supported borrowing to aid in the construction of a facility, to be located at 619 West
3 Walnut Street in the city of Milwaukee, to coordinate and centralize victim and
4 victim advocacy services for families affected by domestic violence. The state funding
5 commitment shall be in the form of a grant to the Children’s Hospital of Wisconsin.
6 Before approving any state funding commitment for construction of such a facility,
7 the building commission shall determine that the Children’s Hospital of Wisconsin
8 has secured additional funding from nonstate sources for the project in an amount
9 at least equal to the amount of the grant.

10 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to the Children’s Hospital of
11 Wisconsin under par. (b) and if, for any reason, the facility that is constructed with
12 funds from the grant is not used as a center for families affected by domestic violence,
13 the state shall retain an ownership interest in the facility equal to the amount of the
14 state’s grant.

15 **SECTION 24e.** 13.48 (39j) of the statutes is created to read:

16 13.48 (39j) DOMESTIC ABUSE INTERVENTION SERVICES, INC. (a) The legislature
17 finds and determines that domestic violence affects families, especially women and
18 children, throughout all communities in Wisconsin and that the construction of
19 shelter facilities and offices for providing services to domestic abuse victims would
20 greatly benefit state residents. It is therefore in the public interest, and it is the
21 public policy of this state, to aid in the construction and remodel of a shelter facility
22 and offices, to be located in the city of Madison, to provide services to domestic abuse
23 victims.

24 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$560,000 in general fund
25 supported borrowing to aid in the construction and remodel of a shelter facility and

1 offices, to be located at 2102 Fordem Avenue in the city of Madison, to provide shelter
2 and services to domestic abuse victims. The state funding commitment shall be in
3 the form of a grant to Domestic Abuse Intervention Services, Inc. Before approving
4 any state funding commitment for expansion of such a facility, the building
5 commission shall determine that Domestic Abuse Intervention Services, Inc., has
6 secured additional funding from nonstate sources for the project.

7 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to Domestic Abuse
8 Intervention Services, Inc., under par. (b) and if, for any reason, the facility that is
9 constructed and remodeled with funds from the grant is not used as a shelter facility
10 and offices to provide services to domestic abuse victims, the state shall retain an
11 ownership interest in the facility equal to the amount of the state's grant.

12 **SECTION 24g.** 13.48 (39k) of the statutes is created to read:

13 13.48 (39k) MEDICAL COLLEGE OF WISCONSIN; COMMUNITY MEDICAL EDUCATION
14 FACILITIES. (a) The legislature finds and determines that expanding access to health
15 care teaching institutions would greatly benefit state residents by addressing the
16 increasing shortage of health care professionals available to provide care to state
17 residents. It is therefore in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state,
18 to assist the Medical College of Wisconsin in the remodel, development, and
19 renovation of 2 community medical education facilities in northeast Wisconsin and
20 central Wisconsin.

21 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$7,384,300 in general fund
22 supported borrowing to aid in the remodel, development, and renovation of 2
23 community medical education facilities in northeast Wisconsin and central
24 Wisconsin. The state funding commitment shall be in the form of a grant to the
25 Medical College of Wisconsin. Before approving any state funding commitment for

1 the remodel, development, and renovation of such facilities, the building commission
2 shall determine that the Medical College of Wisconsin has secured additional
3 funding from nonstate sources for the project in an amount at least equal to the
4 amount of the grant.

5 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to the Medical College of
6 Wisconsin under par. (b) and if, for any reason, the facilities that are remodeled,
7 developed, and renovated with funds from the grant are not used as community
8 medical education facilities, the state shall retain an ownership interest in the
9 facilities equal to the amount of the state's grant.

10 **SECTION 24i.** 13.48 (39L) of the statutes is created to read:

11 13.48 (39L) DANE COUNTY; LIVESTOCK FACILITIES. (a) The legislature finds and
12 determines that the livestock and dairy industry is of vital importance to the
13 economy, workforce, and unique way of life in Wisconsin and that the promotion of
14 this industry would greatly benefit state residents. It is therefore in the public
15 interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to aid in the construction of livestock
16 facilities at the Alliant Energy Center in the city of Madison.

17 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$9,000,000 in general fund
18 supported borrowing to aid in the construction of livestock facilities at the Alliant
19 Energy Center in the city of Madison. The state funding commitment shall be in the
20 form of a grant to Dane County. Before approving any state funding commitment for
21 construction of such facilities, the building commission shall determine that Dane
22 County has secured additional funding from nonstate sources for the project in an
23 amount at least equal to the amount of the grant.

24 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to Dane County under par.
25 (b) and if, for any reason, the facilities that are constructed with funds from the grant

1 are not used for livestock purposes, the state shall retain an ownership interest in
2 the facilities equal to the amount of the state's grant.

3 **SECTION 24j.** 13.48 (39m) of the statutes is created to read:

4 13.48 (39m) KI CONVENTION CENTER. (a) The legislature finds and determines
5 that the meetings and conventions industry is of vital importance in creating jobs
6 and contributing to economic development throughout Wisconsin and that the
7 promotion of this industry would greatly benefit state residents. It is therefore in the
8 public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to aid in the expansion of the
9 K I Convention Center in the city of Green Bay.

10 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$2,000,000 in general fund
11 supported borrowing to aid in the expansion of the K I Convention Center in the city
12 of Green Bay. The state funding commitment shall be in the form of a grant to the
13 city of Green Bay. Before approving any state funding commitment for expansion of
14 such a facility, the building commission shall determine that the city of Green Bay
15 has secured additional funding from nonstate sources for the project.

16 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to the city of Green Bay under
17 par. (b) and if, for any reason, the expanded space that is constructed with funds from
18 the grant is not used to expand the K I Convention Center in the city of Green Bay,
19 the state shall retain an ownership interest in the expanded space equal to the
20 amount of the state's grant.

21 **SECTION 24k.** 13.48 (39n) of the statutes is created to read:

22 13.48 (39n) WISCONSIN MARITIME CENTER OF EXCELLENCE. (a) The legislature
23 finds and determines that the maritime and shipbuilding industry is of vital
24 importance in creating jobs and contributing to economic development throughout
25 Wisconsin and that the promotion of this industry would greatly benefit state

1 residents. It is therefore in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state,
2 to aid in the construction of the Wisconsin Maritime Center of Excellence in
3 Marinette County.

4 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$5,000,000 in general fund
5 supported borrowing to aid in the construction of the Wisconsin Maritime Center of
6 Excellence in Marinette County. The state funding commitment shall be in the form
7 of a grant to the Marinette County Association for Business and Industry, Inc. Before
8 approving any state funding commitment for construction of such a facility, the
9 building commission shall determine that the Marinette County Association for
10 Business and Industry, Inc., has secured additional funding for the project.

11 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to the Marinette County
12 Association for Business and Industry, Inc., under par. (b) and if, for any reason, the
13 facility that is constructed with funds from the grant is not used to promote
14 Wisconsin's maritime and shipbuilding industry, the state shall retain an ownership
15 interest in the facility equal to the amount of the state's grant.

16 **SECTION 24m.** 13.48 (39o) of the statutes is created to read:

17 13.48 (39o) NORSKEDALEN NATURE AND HERITAGE CENTER. (a) The legislature
18 finds and determines that preserving the historical and archaeological heritage of
19 the many immigrant groups and American Indian tribes or bands who have
20 contributed in countless ways to Wisconsin's cultural, social, and economic life would
21 substantially benefit state residents. It is therefore in the public interest, and it is
22 the public policy of this state, to aid in the development of the Norskedalen Nature
23 and Heritage Center heritage site in Vernon County.

24 (b) The building commission may authorize up to \$1,048,300 in general fund
25 supported borrowing to aid in the development of the Norskedalen Nature and

1 Heritage Center heritage site in Vernon County. The state funding commitment
2 shall be in the form of a grant to the Norskedalen Nature and Heritage Center.
3 Before approving any state funding commitment for development of such a site, the
4 building commission shall determine that the Norskedalen Nature and Heritage
5 Center has secured additional funding from nonstate sources for the project.

6 (c) If the building commission authorizes a grant to the Norskedalen Nature
7 and Heritage Center under par. (b) and if, for any reason, the site that is developed
8 with funds from the grant is not used as a historic site, the state shall retain an
9 ownership interest in the site equal to the amount of the state’s grant.”.
