Amendment 13. This is being requested by Senator Jauch's staff—property tax cut.

Amendment 14. Income Tax Cut. (Originally in Amendment #3, new requests, Item 3). Decrease the income tax rate for just the lowest tax bracket. Lowering the bottom rate from 4.60% to 3.88% would reduce total state tax collections by an amount that is similar to the reduction proposed in the Governor's budget, but would result in different distributional effects. With one exception, the average dollar reduction under AB 40 increases with income for each AGI group, reaching almost \$300 for taxpayers with AGI of \$250,000 or more. However, limiting the reduction to the bottom tax rate causes the average dollar reduction to "flatten" and average about \$100 for all AGI groups over \$70,000. This alternative would result in larger average tax reductions for each AGI group with income below \$70,000. This is alternative 2 in LFB Paper #280.

Amendment 15. Index the Homestead Tax Credit. (Originally Budget Amendment Request #1, under revenue and taxation, Item 1). Same as Motion #123.

Amendment 16. Earned Income Tax Credit. (Originally Budget Amendment Request #1, under revenue and taxation, Item 2). Restore 2011/13 cuts. [Assembly Bill 233].

Amendment 17. General Fund Structural Balance. This is a reference to item #27 in the LFB summary of the Republican Assembly Amendment to ASA 1. Remove the provision that eliminates the requirement that no bill may be passed by the legislature if the estimated general fund expenditures exceed estimated revenues in the second year of the fiscal biennium (2013/15 budget bill).

Amendment 18. Sale of State Property. Eliminate changes to DOA's authority to sell and lease state property. [Page 46, Item 6] (Originally Amendment Request #4, Item 9).

Amendment 19. Remove Unemployment Insurance Policy Changes Not Approved by UI Council. (Originally Amendment Request #3, new requests, Item 6). Same as previous request, but please add the 1-week waiting period adopted in the 2011/13 budget.

Amendment 20. (Originally Amendment Request #4, Item 13) Provide funding to reduce UW and WTCS WHEG Grant waiting lists. Provide \$15 million GPR for each, for a total of \$30 million. Require WTCS to use the additional grant money to target students in high demand occupation programs.

Amendment 21. Environmental Package. Please combine the following into one amendment:

- (Originally Amendment Request #4, Item 8) Restore cuts to land acquisition bonding in the Knowles Nelson Stewardship Program (Motion #242). Eliminate the diversion of land acquisition bonding for the Kettle Moraine Fish Hatchery (Paper #451, Alternative B3). Remove new provisions on stewardship land sales (this would delete items 9 & 10 from Motion #267).
- (Originally Amendment Request #1, under Ag and Natural Resources, item 2). Sand Mine Monitoring: Add 8 additional position requested by DNR. Motion #295.
- (Originally Amendment Request #1, under Ag and Natural Resource, item 1). Remove the changes to contested cases regarding high capacity well permits. Delete Motion #375.
- (Originally Amendment Request #4, item 20) Maintain current law regarding construction site erosion. This would delete the provisions in Motion #184.

Amendment 22. Restore Residency Requirements. (Original Amendment Request #1, under other, Item 1) Restore residency requirements to current law. LFB Paper #554, Alternative 7; Delete Motion #161.

Amendment 23. Restore RTA Authority. (Original Amendment Request #3, under new requests, Item 8). Restore the ability for municipalities and counties to enter into RTA agreements if approved by public referendum.

Amendment 24. Remove Provision Impacting Municipal Fees and Budgets. (Original Amendment Request #7, Item 5) Remove the provision impacting appeals to municipal fees – Item 11 on Page 575 of the LFB Summary. Remove the provision requiring municipalities to reduce their levy by the amount of new fees collected for certain services – Item 3 on Page 616 of the LFB Budget Summary.

Amendment 25. Remove Changes to UW Student Fees for Inter-Institutional Student Government. (Originally Amendment Request #4, Item 15). Remove the changes to UW student fees for inter-institutional student government (United Council). This would delete item 13 in Motion #434.

Amendment 26. Restore Community Policing in Milwaukee. This pays for the Shot Spotter program. (Originally Amendment Request #4, Item 25).

*In addition to these requests, we would like to request the stripes on the collective bargaining amendment (Originally Amendment Request #6, Item 1). This has not been introduced yet, but it was requested by Senator Risser. If you need to touch base with his office, the staff person to talk to is Terry Tuschen.
