
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1 “SECTION 1893si. 121.91 (2m) (i) 1g. and 1r. of the statutes are created to read:

2 121.91 (2m) (i) 1g. Multiply the amount of the revenue increase per pupil
3 allowed under this subsection for the previous school year by the sum of 1.0 plus the
4 allowable rate of increase under s. 73.0305 expressed as a decimal.

5 1r. Add the result under subd. 1. to the result under subd. 1g.

6 SECTION 1893sic. 121.91 (2m) (i) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

7 121.91 (2m) (i) 2. Multiply the result under subd. ~~1.~~ 1r. by the average of the
8 number of pupils enrolled in the current and the 2 preceding school years.”.

9 16. Page 1025, line 13: delete “make no adjustment” and substitute “~~make no~~

11 17. Page 1026, line 4: delete “make no adjustment” and substitute “~~make no~~

13 18. Page 1026, line 13: after that line insert:

14 “SECTION 1893stm. 121.91 (4) (L), (m) and (n) of the statutes ~~are~~ ^{is} created to

16 121.91 (4) (L) 1. In this paragraph, “local law enforcement agency” means a
17 governmental unit of one or more persons employed full time by a city, town, village,
18 or county in this state for the purpose of preventing and detecting crime and
19 enforcing state laws or local ordinances, employees of which unit are authorized to
20 make arrests for crimes while acting within the scope of their authority. ✓

21 2. The limit otherwise applicable to a school district under sub. (2m) in any
22 school year is increased by an amount equal to \$100 times the number of pupils
23 enrolled in the school district or \$40,000, whichever is greater, if the school board
24 adopts a resolution to do so, the school board and a local law enforcement agency

1 jointly develop a school safety plan that specifies the purposes of the additional
2 revenue, the school safety plan is consistent with the school safety plan required
3 under s. 118.07 (4), and the school board submits the school safety plan to the
4 department.

5 3. A school district may use the excess revenue under this paragraph to
6 purchase school safety equipment, fund the compensation costs of security officers,
7 or for school safety expenditures consistent with the school safety plan required
8 under s. 118.07 (4). Any additional revenue received by a school district under this
9 paragraph shall not be included in the base for determining the school district's limit
10 under sub. (2m) for the following school year. ↘ ↗

11 (m) 1. If a school board adopts a resolution to do so, the limit otherwise
12 applicable to the school district under sub. (2m) in any school year is increased by the
13 amount spent by the school district in the 2nd previous school year to pay the salary
14 and fringe benefit costs of school nurses, school psychologists, and school counselors
15 employed by the school board or providing such services in the school district under
16 a contract with the school board.

17 2. Any additional revenue received by a school district under this paragraph
18 shall not be included in the base for determining the school district's limit under sub.
19 (2m) for the following school year.

20 (n) 1. If the school board adopts a resolution to do so, the limit otherwise
21 applicable to the school district under sub. (2m) in any school year is increased by the
22 portion, specified in subd. 2., of the amount determined as follows, if a positive
23 number:

24 a. Determine the average amount spent by the school district on transportation
25 per pupil in the 2nd previous school year.

1 b. Determine the statewide average amount spent on transportation per pupil
2 in the 2nd previous school year.

3 c. Subtract the result in subd. 1. b. from the result in subd. 1. a. and multiply
4 the difference by the school district membership in the 2nd previous school year.

5 2. b. In the 2013–14 school year, 50 percent of the amount determined in subd.
6 1. c.

7 c. In the 2014–15 school year or any subsequent year, 100 percent of the amount
8 determined in subd. 1. c.

9 3. Any additional revenue received by a school district under this paragraph
10 shall not be included in the base for determining the school district’s limit under sub.
11 (2m) for the following school year.”

12 **19.** Page 1027, line 21: delete “(o), and” and substitute “(o), and (L)”.

13 **20.** Page 1316, line 14: delete the material beginning with that line and
14 ending with page 1318, line 13.

15 **21.** Page 1373, line 7: after that line insert:

16 “(8q) REVENUE LIMIT ADJUSTMENTS. The treatment of section 121.91 (4) (L), (m),
17 and (n) of the statutes first applies to the calculation of a school district’s revenue
18 limit for the 2013–14 school year.”
