

Good morning Mary,

Sen. Petrowski would like to have a bill drafted that would do all of the following:

- of life*
- 1) Currently, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) offers a Conservation Patron license for \$165 per year to take part in a number of outdoor sporting activities. This draft would provide a lifetime Conservation Patron license available from the DNR for resident Purple Heart recipients of Wisconsin at no cost. Provide that DNR can verify Purple Heart status using form DD 214 or amended DD 215. If the statutes do not currently allow or prohibit a transfer of the license upon the death of the recipient, please include language that expressly prohibits this.
 - 2) Currently, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) offers a hunting, fishing and trapping license that can be purchased at the resident rate by a nonresident who is:
 - a. A member of the Wisconsin National Guard;
 - b. An active member of the Armed Forces stationed in Wisconsin;
 - c. A member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces located in Wisconsin; or
 - d. A current member of the Armed Forces or current member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces stationed out of state who was a resident at the time he or she entered active service.

In addition to those listed above, the draft would provide that a nonresident Purple Heart recipient would be eligible for a hunting, fishing, and trapping license at the resident rate. Provide that DNR can verify Purple Heart status using form DD 214 or the amended DD 215.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a conservation patron license confers a number of fishing, hunting, and trapping privileges and allows free vehicle admission to state parks and related areas. Under this bill, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) must issue a conservation patron license at no cost to a resident applicant who has received a purple heart medal. Under this bill, a conservation patron license issued to a purple heart recipient remains effective as long as the holder is a resident.

Under current law, DNR must issue certain resident hunting, fishing, and trapping approvals to qualified students and eligible members of the armed forces, reserves, or national guard who are not residents. Under this bill, DNR must treat an applicant who is not a resident who has received a purple heart medal as a resident for purposes of determining eligibility for and the cost of obtaining fishing, hunting, or trapping approvals.

Your request proposed that a purple heart recipient who is not a resident be eligible for hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses at the resident rate. However, in some instances stamps, tags, or permits are required in addition to licenses. The term "approval" is used in chapter 29 to mean any license, permit, certificate, card, stamp, or tag issued to grant hunting, fishing, or trapping permission. Therefore, the draft refers to hunting, fishing, and trapping "approvals" instead of licenses. Let me know if this is not consistent with your intent. *(see s. 29.001(12))*

You requested a prohibition on a purple heart recipient transferring a conservation patron license to another person upon the license holder's death. The general rule is that hunting, fishing, and trapping approvals may not be transferred to another person (see s. 29.024 (2) (d)). There are exceptions to this, but not for a conservation patron license. Therefore, as drafted, the purple heart conservation patron license will not be transferrable during the holder's lifetime or upon his or her death. *and no drafting regarding transfers is necessary.*

*INSERT D-NOTE **
Under current law, at the time an applicant is issued a conservation patron license, he or she is also issued a Wisconsin natural resources magazine annual subscription, deer and back tags, and an annual vehicle admission receipt that allows free vehicle admission to state parks and other areas. To ensure that a purple heart recipient gets these benefits each year after obtaining the license, I added language extending these benefits on an annual basis for these licensees. However, as drafted, the licensee must request these benefits on an annual basis. If you would like DNR to issue these benefits automatically each year, let me know.

You requested that the draft provide that DNR can verify an applicant's purple heart status by using form DD 214 or amended DD 215. However, we typically don't specify the type of proof necessary for license eligibility in the statutes because this may change over time. For example, s. 29.194 (1) (b) requires DNR to treat a qualified member of the armed forces, a qualified member of a reserve unit of the armed forces, or a qualified member of the national guard as a resident for purposes of determining eligibility for a hunting, trapping, or fishing approval. However, this section simply requires the applicant to "exhibit proof" that he or she is a member of the armed forces, reserve unit, or national guard, and the type of proof required is left up to DNR. (This is how the proof requirement is written in this draft as well.) *that* *The verification requirement in the draft uses similar language.*

Under current law, at the time an applicant is issued a conservation patron license, he or she is also issued a Wisconsin Natural Resources magazine annual subscription, deer and back tags, and an annual vehicle admission receipt that allows free vehicle admission to state parks and other areas. To ensure that a resident purple heart recipient gets these benefits annually, I added language allowing the license holder to request these benefits each year after the first year the license is issued.

You requested that the draft provide that DNR can verify an applicant's purple heart status by using form DD 214 or amended DD 215. However, we typically don't specify the type of proof necessary for license eligibility in the statutes because this may change over time. For example, s. 29.194 (1) (b) requires DNR to treat a qualified member of the armed forces, a qualified member of a reserve unit of the armed forces, or a qualified member of the national guard as a resident for purposes of determining eligibility for a hunting, trapping, or fishing approval. However, that section simply requires the applicant to "exhibit proof" that he or she is a member of the armed forces, reserve unit, or national guard, and the type of proof required is left up to DNR. The verification requirement in the draft uses similar language.
