Because of the work related to verifying Purple Heart status; we'd like the initial application by a Purple Heart recipient at one of our DNR service centers, and not just one of the ALIS license agents. Once verified the Department would flag the Purple Heart and they would be qualified for life, and could purchase their license at any ALIS license agent.

Good afternoon Elizabeth,

Thanks for your work in putting together the bill for us. After a few discussions with the interested parties, we'd like to request a few changes to the bill as written.

1. Rather than provide the conservation patron license to resident Purple Heart recipients at no charge, specify that the department will charge an annual fee of \$10 for the license. The resident applicant would be required to obtain the initial approval from a DNR service center, but when certified, he / she could renew from any applicable vendor across the state.
  - a. It's unclear whether the last portion of this request ought to be included in statute. DNR may have further instruction on the issue.
2. Similar to other license approvals, include provisions that the charge for a duplicate will be \$2.50.
3. Include a delayed effective date for the provisions of the bill to take place three months following passage.
4. Provide that resident PH applicants would not receive the subscription listed in 29.235 (5), but maintain the provision for nonresident applicants.
5. It looks like we could clean up the bill by incorporating the provisions created as 29.194 (1)(d) into the existing 29.194(1)(b) statutes.

On a separate note, we'd like to authorize you to work with Michael Bruhn, legislative liaison at the DNR, with any concerns the department might have. Mike is Cc'd to this email so that you have his information.

Lis,

Thanks for pointing this out. Parts of the bill draft seemed confusing as we read through it, but I see now what you're referencing. Hopefully this clears up some of the confusion:

The department currently offers a conservation patron license to both residents or non-residents. Our intention in the bill is create TWO additional types of conservation patron license: a resident Purple Heart license to be offered for \$10 annually, and a nonresident Purple Heart license to be offered at the current resident rate (\$165).

After our discussions with the department, we do NOT want to include the magazine subscription in the license for resident members, because of cost issues (DNR hardly makes a profit on the magazine now, so they are unable to recoup the cost). Because nonresident PH applicants are paying the current resident rate of \$165, the magazine subscription will still be available to them (as DNR does not lose money on the deal.)

Please let me know if you have any further questions. I understand this may result in a substantial bill change.



**Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau**

Under current law, a conservation patron license confers a number of fishing, hunting, and trapping privileges and allows free vehicle admission to state parks and related areas. Under this bill, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) must issue a conservation patron license at ~~no cost~~ <sup>reduced fee for non-resident</sup> to a resident applicant who has received a purple heart medal. Under this bill, a conservation patron license issued to a purple heart recipient remains effective as long as the holder is a resident.

Under current law, DNR must treat a qualified member of the armed forces, a reserve unit of the U.S. armed forces, or the national guard as a resident for purposes of determining eligibility for, and cost of, obtaining fishing, hunting, or trapping approvals. Fees for approvals issued to residents are lower than for those issued to nonresidents. This bill expands this treatment to a nonresident who has received the purple heart medal.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

We received the second prelim draft for LRB-1428. After a few discussions with the boss, we'd like to take a step backward and make a revision to the bill.

Currently, a hunting, fishing and trapping license can be purchased at the resident rate by a nonresident who is:

- - a member of the Wisconsin National Guard;
- - an active member of the Armed Forces stationed in Wisconsin;
- - a member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces located in Wisconsin; or
- - a current member of the Armed Forces or current member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces stationed out of state who was a resident at the time he or she entered active service.

On the list above, we'd like to also include a nonresident who is a recipient of the Purple Heart. This would be similar and in addition to the nonresident conservation patron license included in the /P2 draft.

I know this runs contrary to earlier instructions, and I apologize for the inconvenience. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Currently, a hunting, fishing and trapping license can be purchased at the resident rate by a nonresident who is:

- - a member of the Wisconsin National Guard;
- - an active member of the Armed Forces stationed in Wisconsin;
- - a member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces located in Wisconsin; or
- - a current member of the Armed Forces or current member of a Reserve Unit of the Armed Forces stationed out of state who was a resident at the time he or she entered active service.


On the list above, we'd like to also include a nonresident who is a recipient of the Purple Heart. This would be similar and in addition to the nonresident conservation patron license included in the /P2 draft.


