

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, any person 16 years of age or over may enter into an indenture, which is a contract whereby the person (apprentice) is to receive from his or her employer, in consideration for the apprentice's services, instruction in any trade, craft, or business. That instruction may include related classroom instruction.

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to administer a tuition reimbursement program under which DWD may reimburse, as provided in the bill, the cost of tuition incurred by a person who has completed an apprenticeship program and who is employed in the trade, craft, or business in which the person was trained under the apprenticeship program. Under the bill, the amount of that reimbursement is 25 percent of the total cost of the person's tuition, minus any grants or scholarships that the person received specifically for the payment of tuition, or \$1,000, whichever is less, except that if the amount of funds applied for exceeds the amount available for tuition reimbursement, DWD may reduce the reimbursement percentage or deny applications for reimbursement that would otherwise qualify for reimbursement. In that case, DWD must determine the reimbursement percentage and eligibility on the basis of the dates on which applications for reimbursement were received

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, any person 16 years of age or over may enter into an indenture, which is a contract whereby the person (apprentice) is to receive from his or her employer, in consideration for the apprentice's services, instruction in any trade, craft, or business. That instruction may include related classroom instruction.

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to administer a tuition reimbursement program under which DWD may reimburse, as provided in the bill, the cost of tuition incurred by a person who has completed an apprenticeship program and who is employed in the trade, craft, or business in which the person was trained under the apprenticeship program. Under the bill, the amount of that reimbursement is 25 percent of the total cost of the person's tuition, minus any grants or scholarships that the person received specifically for the payment of tuition, or \$1,000, whichever is less, except that if the amount of funds applied for exceeds the amount available for tuition reimbursement, DWD may reduce the reimbursement percentage or deny applications for reimbursement that would otherwise qualify for reimbursement. In that case, DWD must determine the reimbursement percentage and eligibility on the basis of the dates on which applications for reimbursement were received.

Hi Waylon,

Couple quick points that both Tristan and Connie brought up.

1. Employers often cover the cost of tuition for their apprentices for apprentice-related instruction. Should this program be available to employers as well?
2. Given that many employers cover some or all of the cost of technical college instruction, does there need to be an acknowledgement or certification by the employer and/or technical college that the tuition was paid by the apprentice?
3. Program would take estimated .5 FTE to administer. No sure about any discussion of admin cost for program unless expected to absorb within current funding.


