

Hello Tami,

I have answers for you on all three bills.

- 1) CIT grants, I just want to clarify that these are not matching funds, with an additional \$250,000 on the bill, and it can come out of 46.54
- 2) Mobile Crisis Teams, this should be a 2:1 county match, with an additional appropriation of \$250,000 in the bill and it can come out of 46.54
- 3) County Peer-Run Centers: this should also be a 2:1 county match, with an additional appropriation of \$250,000 in the bill but could fit under 46.48 but still separate of the (31) since those peer run centers are regional based.

I think that should answer your question on those. Let me know if anything else comes up. Thank you for everything.

AJ,

As we discussed, I am wondering about the funding for the grant programs in the email below. Obviously, I can create a grant program with a new appropriation entirely, but there are a couple of places that already have similar grant programs. The funding for the grants (and the grant requirements) could be incorporated into either 46.54 or 46.48 (see below) and the moneys taken out of the same appropriations (the amounts in the schedule may need to be increased to accommodate the new grant programs).

You mentioned one time funding. If you just want these grant programs for this biennium, I can create them as nonstatutory provisions.

Obviously, not all of the grants need to come from the same appropriation. I will draft each grant program as a separate bill.

46.54 Consumer and family self-help and peer-support programs. From the appropriation under s. 20.435 (5) (md), the department shall distribute \$874,000 in each fiscal year to increase support for mental health family support projects, employment projects operated by consumers of mental health services, mental health crisis intervention and drop-in projects, and public mental health information activities.

(Tami's note: this appropriation is federal moneys)

46.48 Grants for community programs.

(1) GENERAL. From the appropriation accounts under s. 20.435 (5) (bc) and (7) (bc), the department shall award grants for community programs as provided in this section.

...(There are multiple grants under this section.)

(31) PEER RUN RESPITE CENTERS. The department may distribute not more than \$1,200,000 in each fiscal year, beginning in fiscal year 2014-15, to regional peer run respite centers for individuals with mental health and substance abuse concerns.

Hello Mike,

Not sure if you are the correct person to work with on this, but the Speaker's Task Force on Mental Health is recommending the establishment of three grant programs to be administered by the Department of Health Services.

- 1) Provide grants for crisis intervention team (CIT) training for law enforcement agencies throughout the state as well as within the Department of Corrections
- 2) Provide matching fund grants to counties in order to establish mobile crisis teams to serve individuals in mental health crisis in rural areas.
- 3) Provide matching fund grants to counties to pilot peer-run respite centers. We would like to specify that the funds are to be used by a county to contract with a peer-run organization, since counties are not "peer-run" and thus would not qualify for this funding.

Please let me know if you are the one drafting these proposals and if you have any questions. Having not worked with grant program drafts in the past, we are open to incorporating these into one draft if possible, or if it would make more sense into three separate drafts.

The moneys must come from the federal appropriation. That means that if there are grant programs coming out of the same federal moneys these two grants programs, since they specify a total, might reduce the amounts available for other programs. But, since the grant programs specify they are to be paid from the federal appropriation, then those bills shouldn't implicate state funds and they act like allocations from the federal funds.
