2. Privately Contracted Special Ed. Substitute Teachers

Under current law, if a school district directly contracts for the services of a special education substitute teacher, the district is allowed categorical aid reimbursement for those services. If the district contracts with a private contractor to provide the substitutes, the district is not allowed categorical aid reimbursement. Allow school boards to contract with public or private agencies for "substitute teaching services" under Wisconsin Statute 115.88 (1).

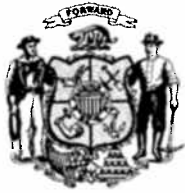

This bill explicitly authorizes a school district to contract with substitute teaching staffing services and makes the costs of such a contract eligible for special education aid.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

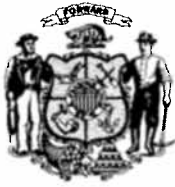

3 115.88 (1) PERSONNEL. A school board, board of control of a cooperative
4 educational service agency or, upon authorization of the county board, a county
5 children with disabilities education board may employ, for a special education
6 program, either full-time or part-time licensed teachers, licensed coordinators of

1 special education, school nurses, licensed school social workers, licensed school
2 psychologists, licensed school counselors, paraprofessionals, licensed consulting
3 teachers to work with any teacher of regular education programs who has a child
4 with a disability in a class and any other personnel approved by the department. The
5 board may contract with substitute teaching staffing services and with private or
6 public agencies for physical or occupational therapy services, orientation and
7 mobility training services, educational interpreter services, educational audiology,
8 speech and language therapy, pupil transition services for eligible pupils who are 18
9 to 21 years old, or any service approved by the state superintendent, on the basis of
10 demonstrated need. A school board may contract with a charter school to provide
11 special education services to pupils attending the charter school if the charter school
12 is under contract with the school board under s. 118.40 (2m) and the charter school
13 is not an instrumentality of the school district.
