<b>Description</b> Commercial motor vehicle out-of-service violations					

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

As of October 2010, federal law requires commercial drivers to be disqualified (suspended) for no fewer than 180 days nor more than 1 year when convicted of violating an out-of-service order when transporting nonhazardous materials. Current Wisconsin law only requires a minimum of 90 days disqualification for violation of an out-of-service order when transporting nonhazardous material. This bill brings the Department of Transportation into compliance with federal law and maintains eligibility for certain federal highway aids.

If Wisconsin were found to be in non-compliance under federal law, the first non-compliance penalty would be \$25,861,917. Penalties double for second and each subsequent year of non-compliance.

The Department expects that the legislation will impose no new costs or administrative burdens, nor will it produce new state revenues.
