Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, if a person violates a condition of probation, and the violation is not a crime, the person must be ordered back to prison for a period not to exceed 90 days if the person is not required to register as a sex offender.

Prosecutors did not reach a consensus on this bill. Some believe it will have no effect on the current workload; however, others believe that this will require prosecutors to undertake an entirely new prosecution to get the probationer back in prison. Consequently, a fiscal estimate is indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

For the reasons cited above, a long-term fiscal impact for this bill is indeterminate.
