Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The cost of this program is indeterminate due to the unknown number of veterans that would use the service. However, based on the Department's estimated populations for the counties mentioned in the bill, approximately 64,649 veterans would be eligible for the legal services outlined in the bill. Based on an estimated \$100 dollar per hour rate, the theoretical cost for providing these services could be \$6,464,900 if each veteran used just one hour of service. It should be noted that there are several avenues that already exist that are designed to provide legal assistance to Wisconsin veterans. Waupaca County has established a legal assistance program, the State Public Defender has the Veterans Intervention Program, the American Bar Association has the Military Pro Bono Project and the Marquette and UW law schools offer free help to qualifying veterans. There is also several treatment courts throughout the state focusing on helping veterans with alcohol, drug and mental health issues.
