Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill makes changes to the definition of trafficking, adds to the trafficking-related offenses under which a person is guilty of a felony, and establishes a process for a trafficking victim convicted of prostitution to request the conviction, adjudication or finding be vacated or the record expunged. This bill adds criteria under which a person is guilty of a felony as it relates to prostitution-related compensation and sexual offenses against children. In addition, this bill makes changes to sharing information contained in a presentence investigation report, allows evidence of other crimes, wrongs or acts to be admissible in prosecutions related to certain offenses, adds to the list of serious sex offenses for which a court may place an individual who has committed such an offense under lifetime supervision, and adds strangulation to several statutes.

The Department does not anticipate a fiscal effect to the Department or local human services agencies.
