## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill requires that transit bus drivers provide the same proof of physical fitness that is required of school bus operators. The potential additional cost is the administrative cost of notifying bus drivers of the requirement to provide proof of physical fitness every two years (every year if the driver is age 70 or older) and processing such documentation when received. It may be possible for transit operators to meet these administrative requirements without additional staff time or equipment.

The effect of requiring proof of physical fitness may mean an increased number of driver terminations and the corresponding need to hire and train new bus drivers. However, these costs may be offset by reduced transit accidents caused by "unfit" drivers, which is the apparent purpose of this bill.

Even if it were possible to reasonably project whether the net effect of this bill would be costs or savings, this office does not have access to mass transit data for financial analysis.
