### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, if a person under age 25 commits a crime for which the maximum imprisonment is six years or less, a court may order at the time of sentencing that the court's record of the crime and conviction be expunged when the person successfully completes their sentence. This bill will not allow a court, at the time of sentencing, to enter an order of expungement upon successful completion of the sentence. Rather, a court may allow expungement after the person has completed their sentence.

Prosecutors do not anticipate any fiscal effect on their offices should this bill be enacted.

### Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Should this bill be enacted, prosecutors do not expect there to be a long-term fiscal impact on their offices.
