Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law prohibits the installation or use of a surveillance device which has been installed in a private place to observe a nude or partially nude person without their consent. This bill clarifies that a surveillance device only needs to be capable of observing the activities of a person, and identifies specific activities that are illegal. Violators of current law and this bill are guilty of a Class I felony.

Because a violation under the proposed bill is a Class I felony, which is the same felony level as current law, prosecutors do not expect the enactment of this bill to have a fiscal impact on their workload.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Prosecutors do not expect there to be a long-term fiscal effect on their office should this bill be enacted.
