## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires that every school district operating grades kindergarten to 5 ensure that pupils in those grades participate in physical education for at least 30 minutes each day on which school is held.

Local: The cost of requiring a school district operating grades kindergarten to grade 5 to ensure that pupils in those grades receive at least 30 minutes of physical education each day on which school is held is indeterminate. It is unknown how much physical education is provided in each school district. School districts are currently required to provide 3 sessions of physical education but can provide more if they choose to. Thus, some school districts may already be providing at least 30 minutes of physical education each school day. As a result, the local fiscal effect will vary from local unit to local unit and is indeterminate.

State: The Department's physical education consultant may be asked to provide instructional assistance to local school districts to help them comply with the law. In addition, the Department may send a bulletin to school districts informing them of the change in the law. The cost of performing these tasks is indeterminate but could be absorbed by the Department.
