<b>Description</b> Prohibiting revocation of probation, extended supervision, or parole for failure to pay restitution or certain fees					

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a person placed on probation, parole, or extended supervision may be required to pay a fee to the Department of Corrections (DOC) to partially reimburse DOC for the costs of providing supervision. Under current law, if a person violates a condition of probation, parole, or supervision, his/her period of extension may be modified, extended, or revoked.

Under this bill, a person may not have his or her probation or release to parole or extended supervision revoked solely because he/she fails to pay a supervision fee or restitution.

Prosecutors do not believe this bill will have a fiscal effect on their offices.

### Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Prosecutors do not anticipate that this bill will have a long-term fiscal impact on their offices.
