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Description Collecting and analyzing data related to certain strip searches		

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires that a law enforcement officer who performs or directs another person to perform a strip search on a detainee who is incarcerated, imprisoned, or otherwise detained in a jail or prison for fewer than 12 hours must keep a record of the strip search. This record must include the nine data points specified in the bill. Each law enforcement agency must submit these records each month to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for analysis.

Because Department of Corrections (DOC) staff are not considered law enforcement officers, this bill's requirements would not have a fiscal impact on the DOC.

Neither the DOC nor several sheriffs who were consulted were able to quantify the estimated local fiscal effect of this bill. The extent to which this bill's reporting requirements would have a local fiscal effect would depend on the number of applicable strip searches conducted by local detention facilities, the amount of time it would take to collect and record the required information regarding each strip search, and the resources needed for law enforcement agencies to transmit any such records to the DOJ each month.
