2015 SENATE BILL 301

Senate Bill 301 makes two changes to the hunting mentorship program. First, the bill removes the requirement that a person be at least 10 years old in order to hunt in the hunting mentorship program. Second, it removes the requirement that the mentor and the mentee may jointly have only one firearm, only one bow, or only one crossbow, in their possession or control while hunting.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Amendment 1 adds a provision which specifies that in a group deer hunting party, no member of the group hunting party who is serving as a mentor for another member of the group hunting party may kill a deer for the person being mentored or use a deer tag issued to the person being mentored.

BILL HISTORY

Senate Amendment 1 was offered by Senator Moulton on December 8, 2015. On January 5, 2016, the Senate Committee on Sporting Heritage, Mining, and Forestry recommended adoption of the amendment on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 3; Noes, 2.
