2015 SENATE BILL 626

Current law allows a court to grant a petitioner a restraining order or injunction against a respondent, enjoining the respondent from certain acts of harassment or abuse. Senate Bill 626 allows a court, when granting such an injunction to a petitioner, to also order a wireless telephone service provider to transfer control of the petitioner's telephone number, or numbers used by minor children of the petitioner, from the respondent to the petitioner.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Under Senate Amendment 1, the bill would take effect on the first day of the 3rd month following publication.

BILL HISTORY

Senate Amendment 1 was offered by Senator Roth on February 1, 2016. On February 4, 2016, the Senate Committee on Workforce Development, Public Works, and Military Affairs recommended adoption of the amendment, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0. The committee recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
