Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, beginning the 2018-19 school year, the Department of Public Instruction must award grants on a competitive basis to school boards and operators of independent charter schools for the purpose of collaborating with community mental health agencies to provide mental health services to pupils. Current law specifies that DPI must award at least \$3,250,000 in these grants each school year.

This bill increases the funding for these grants by \$7,000,000 and requires DPI to award at least \$10,250,000 in these grants each school year.

State: This bill increases state expenditures by \$7 million GPR annually, beginning in FY19, and requires the Department to award at least \$10.25 million GPR in these grants each school year. Because the grant program already exists, the additional work associated with increasing the appropriation (and potentially the number of grantees) would likely be absorbed within the Department's base budget.

Local: Indeterminate It is unknown how many school boards and operators of independent charter schools will apply for these competitive grants and the amount that each applicant would request. For those reasons the net impact (program costs and grant revenues) are indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

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The \$7 million GPR appropriated beginning in FY19 would be an ongoing state expenditure unless it was changed in the future by the legislature.
