Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Subject to certain exceptions, current legislation prohibits a minor from being employed or permitted to work at any employment unless the minor's employer obtains a written permit that authorizes the employment of the minor.

Also subject to certain exceptions, current law prohibits a minor from working in any "street trade" unless the minor's employer obtains a street trade permit from the Department of Workforce Development or designated permit officer. Minors are also required to obtain an identification card.

This bill eliminates the requirements to obtain permits and identification cards for minors who are 16 years of age or older. This bill also changes the terminology in current law from "child labor" to "the employment of minors" and eliminates a provision regarding certain performances that feature children.

This bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department of Corrections. Probation and parole agents assist juveniles in obtaining work permits as needed however any reduction in time spent obtaining work permits would be dedicated to other case management items.

This bill will have no local fiscal impact. While local secure detention facilities may assist juveniles, as needed, in obtaining work permits upon release, any reduction in time spent assisting juveniles obtain permits would likely be used for other case management items.
