Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a person who has been found to be a sexually violent person may be involuntarily committed to the Department of Health Services for control, care, and treatment. If a person is committed and placed in institutional care, the person may periodically petition the court for supervised release. If a court determines that supervised release is appropriate, DHS must prepare for the court a supervised release plan for the person. Before preparing the plan, current law requires DHS to consult with a local law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the prospective residential option. This bill requires DHS to also notify and, upon their request, consult with the district attorney and pertinent local governmental units in the county of intended placement.

Prosecutors believe this legislation will cause little to no fiscal impact on their offices. One prosecutor said this bill could reduce work slightly for offices because DAs would no longer have to request this information from DHS. The fiscal estimate is indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The long-range fiscal implications of this bill on district attorneys offices are indeterminate.
