## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the provision of feminine hygiene products to an inmate of a jail, prison, juvenile correctional facility, juvenile detention facility, secured residential care center for children and youth, other house of correction, or a secured unit of a mental health institute free of charge and in accordance with the inmate's personal health care needs.

The Department of Corrections projects a cost increase of approximately \$81,000 GPR annually as a result of this bill. In order to comply with this bill, the DOC will have to provide tampons, sanitary napkins, and panty liners in multiple sizes for free to female inmates and juveniles. The DOC currently provides its adult female inmates with tampons and sanitary napkins in one size. DJC currently provides its average daily population of 20.5 female juveniles with tampons and sanitary napkins for free in one size and sells panty liners in one size to inmates as part of its canteen.

The local fiscal impact of the bill is an indeterminate increase. County jails are not currently required to provide the feminine hygiene products specified in the bill. The feminine hygiene products offered to offenders in county jails varies throughout the state so the cost to comply with this bill will vary based on the current offerings of each county jail.
